Geneva Nurses Hold Discussion

Geneva - A panel discussion on "The Moral Ethics in Nursing" featured a meeting of the Geneva Chapter, Catholic Nurses, Wednesday, in St. Stephen's School hall.

Rev. Raymond Ringwood, spiritual moderator, opened the program with prayer. Mrs. Dorothy Buckley, president of the unit, introduced the speakers.

PANELISTS WERE Rev. Paul Wohlrab, spiritual moderator of the Rochester Diocesan Council Catholic Nurses; Rev. William Hickey, chaplain of St. James' Hospital, Rosendell; Marion S. Whelan, director of the School of Practical Nurses, and Dr. James Walker, pathologist at Geneva Hospital.

Questions from the audience to the panelists covered the ethical and moral nursing aspects of prolonged hypnosis in terminal cancer; professional secrecy; should the patient be told he has cancer.

Questions also included the eye bank, use of tranquilizers, and other subjects.

FATHER WOHLRAB advised the nurses to have the greatest respect for the patient's condition and to develop an ordinary, quiet, and respectful manner of professional dignity.

After the program, refreshments were served. Mrs. Loreta Linehan, president of the Rochester Diocesan Council of Catholic Nurses, and Mrs. Katherine Carroll, public health nurse, presided.

Since her retirement from active teaching, Sister Syra had been living at St. Mary's Convent, Waterloo.
