Is it possible for couples to grow apart rather than together during marriage? Our last child married a few months ago, and now, not only our home but our lives seem terribly empty. I guess we were so busy with the children we didn't have much time for each other. Joe has worked yery hard, but most of his interests are his own. Your problem is not as uncommon as you may think, Rose. To some extent, it is a new problem.

Owing to the earlier age at marriage, smaller families, and increased average length of life. the average couple marry ing in 1950 could expect to have 41 years of married life together. Under present childbearing patterns, this means that they would have 14 years together after their dast child had left home and married.

This represents a remarkable change in the traditional family cycle. For example, couples marrying in 1890 could expect only about 31 years of joint survival, and there was a fifty-filly chance that one of the partners would die at least two years before their youngest child had married.

These figures suggest that your problem may become an mportant one for many cou-

Well, Rose, I think you poirried out the common source of the difficulty. The average family cycle places heavy demarids for adaptability upon the couple. They start life together in the narrow circle of loving twosome.

Once children arrive, father devotes increasing energy and interest to his job because he now has added motives to succeed, while mother is fully absorbed in the thousand and one details related to bearing, rearing, and launching her brood in life.
