# McQuaid Opens Season With Win

The Knights of McQuaid Jesuit High School opened the 1936-37 basketball season with an impressive 62-44 win over the Bombers of East Rochester High School last Saturday on the latter's court.

Sparked by Tom Nientimp, who scored 23 points, McQuaid outscored the Bombers 33 to 21 in the second half after holding a slim 29-23 lead at halftime.

NIENTIMP AND Jim McCarthy featured the early second half scoring as they sent McQuaid out to a 47-35 lead at the end of the third period. Gordon Ide also starred for the Knights, winding up with 12 points, while McCarthy garnered eight.

East Rochester's Pete Osbourn and Frank Schlessing led the Bombers with 12 points each. In a preliminary game, the Rochester JV's trounced McQuaid JV's, 53 to 40.

McQuaid's next game is against Mt. Carmel High of Auburn tomorrow, Saturday.

Anticipating that 20 million letters and cards will be mailed in Rochester by Dec. 24, the Rochester Post Office completed its Christmas organization this week, announced extra hours for stamp and parcel post windows, and listed some important points to be observed in mailing cards and packages.

Parcel post and stamp windows at the main office will be open Saturday, Dec. 6 from 8 until 5:30 p. m. The stations and branches will be open Saturday, Dec. 6 from 9 a. m. until 5:30 p. m. at the main office only; these windows will be open Sunday, Dec. 7 from noon until 6 p. m.

Beginning Monday, Dec. 8 and

continuing through Saturday, Dec. 13 the parcel post and stamp windows at the main office will be open from 8 a. m. until 5:30 p. m. The stations and branches will be open from 9 a. m. until 7 p. m. during the same period.

The postmaster urged early mailing of all Christmas gift parcels. Those intended for the far west should be mailed this week end; in addressing mail be sure to use complete, legible addresses, street and number; city, zone and state. The Rochester Postal Zone Guide will be published in the Sunday, Dec. 7 Democrat & Chronicle. The postmaster urges everyone to watch for it, remove it and use it when addressing your local cards this Christmas.
