Person's Effort Never Wasted

Hornell — Individual effort is never wasted if the motive is worthy, Rev. John P. O'Malley told a First Saturday luncheon group here.

Father O'Malley, pastor of St. Mary's Church, Batavia, and former assistant pastor of St. Ann's, was principal speaker at the Dec. 6 luncheon in the new Sherwood Hotel.

"THE LUNCHEON WAS the third in the current series sponsored by the St. Louis Deaneery, Diocesan Council of Catholic Women, in honor of Our Lady of Fatima.

Referring especially to women's role in life today, Father O'Malley reminded the luncheon guests of their heritage since the days when Christ lived on earth.

"Plato's wife sought to persuade her husband from participating in sending Christ to His death. The women of Jerusalem followed Our Divine Lord in His sorrowful journey to Calvary. Again, women were the first to visit the tomb following His resurrection," Father O'Malley said.

"IN SEEKING TO follow the example of heroic goodness of the early Christian women, the woman of today may sometimes feel lost in the crowd. Remember, however, that even in today's complex world, the individual can accomplish much.

"For example, a young woman working at the ordinary job of mimeographing radio and TV scripts merely noted on the margin, 'Who wrote this stuff?'"

"That little comment prompted her employer to read the script more carefully and to return it to the writer with instructions to eliminate suggestive passages and rewrite the script in good taste," Father O'Malley continued.

"WE MUST NOT let our fear of failure bring on a lethargy of living. A person who sits back for fear of making a mistake never accomplishes anything.

"Babe Ruth struck out more times than any other baseball player on his way to setting the all-time home run record. We must go on bravely, realizing the importance of individual effort," he concluded.

Rev. William Hickey, spiritual director of the St. Louis Deaneery, extended his good wishes and blessings for the Christmas season.

Josephine Fitzgerald, deaneery president, presided at the luncheon. The speaker table was decorated with a Hummel reproduction of the Nativity, surrounded by masses of holly.

The next First Saturday luncheon will be held Feb. 7.
