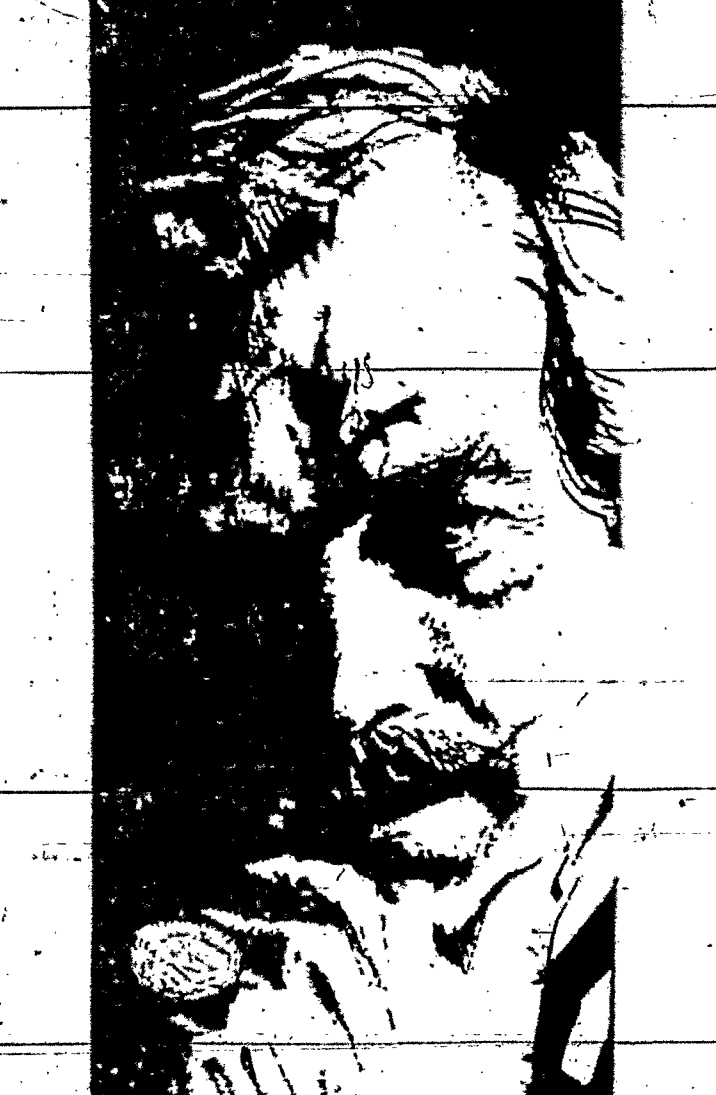
## Holy Name Men Reception Set
