But the frankfurts were meatless, made entirely of tuna fish. Meatless or not, they found favor with the student body as over 1,000 frankfurts and rolls were consumed during the luncheon period.

The new natural hot dog flavor, meatless seafood frankfurts, are manufactured by Tuna Products Corp. in Boston, Mass., and distributed locally by Plover City Frozen Foods, a division of Seneca Frozen Foods.

There is no fish taste, just the delicate and distinctive meaty flavor of choice frankfurts. They may be eaten hot or cold. Soon to be released by Tuna Products Corp. are other new products, including smoked terrina ham and fresh chicken tuna loins.
