

'Hot Dogs' On Friday

'Tunies' Get Students OK

The familiar cry of "Get your hot dogs while they're hot" may be missing from ball parks on Fridays in the near future.

Instead, the vendors will say, "Get your 'Tunies' while they're hot."

AND, YOU CAN bet your bottom dollar that they'll sell like hotcakes — if last Friday at Nazareth Academy is any criterion.

The Breast-O-Chicken Tuna Fish Company, now introducing its new product, "Tunies," to the East Coast — asked the students at the Lake Averas Academy to sample the "Tunies" that day.

"Tunies" look like, taste like and smell like regular hot dogs — but they don't contain meat in any way, shape or form. They're made of tuna fish, with spices, and seasoning added.

ALL TOLD, 369 of this Godsend product made for people who don't like fish were served Friday.

After the experiment, the students were asked their opinion, with the following result:

280 liked them; 51 thought they were all right and 26 didn't like them — but many of these students said they didn't like hot dogs anyway.

CHRIES LIKE "They're terrific! Best menu yet." "Really delicious." "It tastes better than a hot dog" were heard all over the school's cafeteria after the sampling.

"Tunies" are an invention of William Lane and Curt Schirmer of California.

Lane got his idea while he was a student at Loyola University of Los Angeles when attending the

Friday night football game between his school and Santa Clara, he noted the disgust of hot dog vendors at their inability to eliminate the smell of fish and started to manufacture.

AFTER WORLD War Two, he and Schirmer got together and after four years solved the problems they confronted them mainly to eliminate the smell of fish and started to manufacture.

After being introduced on the West Coast, "Tunies" became an overwhelming favorite and this year the Breast-O-Chicken Company began a promotional program to make "Tunies" a nation-wide seller.

The company's representative

"Frankfurts" were also on the menu at McQuaid Jesuit High School cafeteria last Friday.

But the "Frankfurts" were meatless, made entirely of tuna fish. Meatless or not, they found favor with the student body as over 1,000 frankfurts and rolls were consumed during the luncheon period.

The new natural hot dog flavor, meatless Seafordy frankfurts, are manufactured by Tuna Products Corp. in Boston, Mass., and distributed locally by Flores City Frozen Foods, a division of Seneca Frosted Foods.

There is no fish taste, just the delicate and distinctive meaty flavor of choice frankfurts. They may be eaten hot or cold. Soon to be released by Tuna Products Corp. are other new products, including smoked tuna hams and fresh chicken tuna rolls.
