Archbishop John C. McQuaid of Dublin recently requested that all writings of the Servant of God be handed over to him so they can be forwarded to Archbishop John J. McCarthy, C.S.S.P. of Nairobi, Kenya, British East Africa, in whose diocese the cause is being conducted. Although suffering from incurable tuberculosis, Miss Quinn carried out her mission throughout Kenya, Nyasaland, Uganda, Tanganyika, Mauritius, the Indian Ocean, Zanzibar and South Africa.
