### Chaldean Patriarch Installed In Iraq Rite

Mosul, Iraq — (NC) — His Beatitude Paul II Chelko has been enthroned in the cathedral here as Patriarch of Babylonia of the Chaldeans and spiritual leader of the world's Chaldean Rite Catholics.

THE PATRIARCH was enthroned following his election by a synod of Chaldean Rite bishops at the nearby monastery of Deir al-Saida. He succeeds the late Joseph VII Ghannima, who died in Baghdad in July.

The Patriarch is expected to divide his time between Baghdad and Mosul. The Chaldean Rite, over which he presides, is the largest Christian group in Iraq, numbering approximately 200,000 members according to the latest estimate. Apart from his thorough knowledge of Oriental languages, the Patriarch is well versed in French, Italian and Latin.

Chaldean Rite Catholics are the descendants of the Nestorian schismatics who began returning to the Church in the 16th century.

### Girls Home Planned In Kenya

Nairobi, Kenya — (RNS) — Roman Catholic Church authorities in Nairobi are negotiating with the Kenya government for assistance to build a "moral welfare home" here to counter the growing menace of prostitution among teen-age African girls.

The Catholic plan is being seriously discussed by the Nairobi City Council. Other religious and welfare groups also are showing interest in the project. Meanwhile, the Kenya government has offered to provide a site close to the city to build the institution.
