Clark, 69, of Washington, D.C., formerly of Corning, died Dec. 8, 1938 at the Veterans Administration Hospital in Washington.

He was a native of Blossburg, Pa., the son of the late Daniel and Catherine Cairns Clark. He attended local schools as a youth.

A former director and treasurer of the Washington Permanent Building Association, Clark was a national bank examiner for 22 years. He joined the Building Association in 1945 and retired last year.

Clark was a graduate of Elmira Business Institute and the McNamara Secretarial School in Corning.

During World War One, he served as a first lieutenant in the Army Quartermaster Corps.

While a bank examiner for the National Bank Association, he had complete supervision of examinations of local Building and Loan Associations in Washington, under the comptroller of the currency.

He was a member of the Lodge of Elks and the Holy Name Society.

Surviving are his wife, the former Bertha Kern of Corning, and one son, John W. Clark, both of Washington, and one sister, Mrs. Thomas Hassett of New York City.
