Vatican City — (NC) — God-fearing families are the strength and bulwark of vilages, cities and nations," Pope John XXIII told throngs in St. Peter's Square Sunday, feast of the Holy Family.

He spoke of his own childhood in the religious atmosphere of a Christian family home where poverty and prayer were his daily experience.

THE PONTIFF gave his talk at noon through loudspeakers which boomed his message across the vast square in front of the Vatican basilica. He stood at a window in his papal palace.

Assuring his listeners that the God-fearing family is the strength of the nation, he ex-plained that "It is the nucleus and foundation of every virtue, the protection against dangers of corruption, the source of new and healthy energles for the welfare of individuals and of civilized

Pope John spoke of the hidden sufferings of the Holy Family and expressed his concern for the difficulties faced by large families. Because of their faithfulness to the law of God, he said, they often suffer trials and privations unknown to others. He invited better-off families to help their needy brothers.

The Pope expressed concern for young men and women whose desire to raise their own families is confronted with the serious economic difficulties of


