

**Women Told:  
Unite To Combat  
Forces Of Evil**

Bath—Rev. E. Leo McMannus, professor of homiletics and English at St. Bernard's Seminary, in a talk last week before members of St. Mary's Rosary and Altar Society declared that "the forces of evil are well organized and spiritual organizations must be well organized to combat them."

The diocesan moderator of the Rochester Diocesan Council of Catholic Women made these comments in regard to the local organization being affiliated with the National diocesan society.

"The National Council offers committee programs to strengthen the spirituality of Catholic women," Father McMannus continued. He added that it offers various recommendations and guides for local organizations.

PURPOSE, he continued, is to unite and coordinate these women organizations in the United States. Telling of the basic

strength of the National Catholic Council, the speaker said nine million women are represented in 12,000 parish groups.

His comments were heard by 130 Catholic women attending the meeting. Mrs. Joseph Mowchan, president, conducted the session. Other officers of the new group are Mrs. Richard Giovanni, vice president; Frieda Fl. Wendell Miller, corresponding secretary; and Mrs. Richard Perry, treasurer.

She is a member of St. James Church, Waverly; Court Joan of Arc, Catholic Daughters of America, and the Sacred Heart Guild.

In addition she was chairman and campaign director for the March of Dimes in Tioga County; was fund raising chairman for the Cancer Drive in South Waverly in 1956, Red Cross in 1957, Heart Drive, 1957; is past president of the junior auxiliary to Tioga General Hospital in Waverly for 1951 and 1952; became president of the general auxiliary in 1956 and still holds that office.

SHE IS ALSO past chairman for volunteer service with the Blood Bank in Waverly; president of the Democratic Women's Auxiliary of Bradford County, Pa. and Democratic party committee member for South Waverly.
