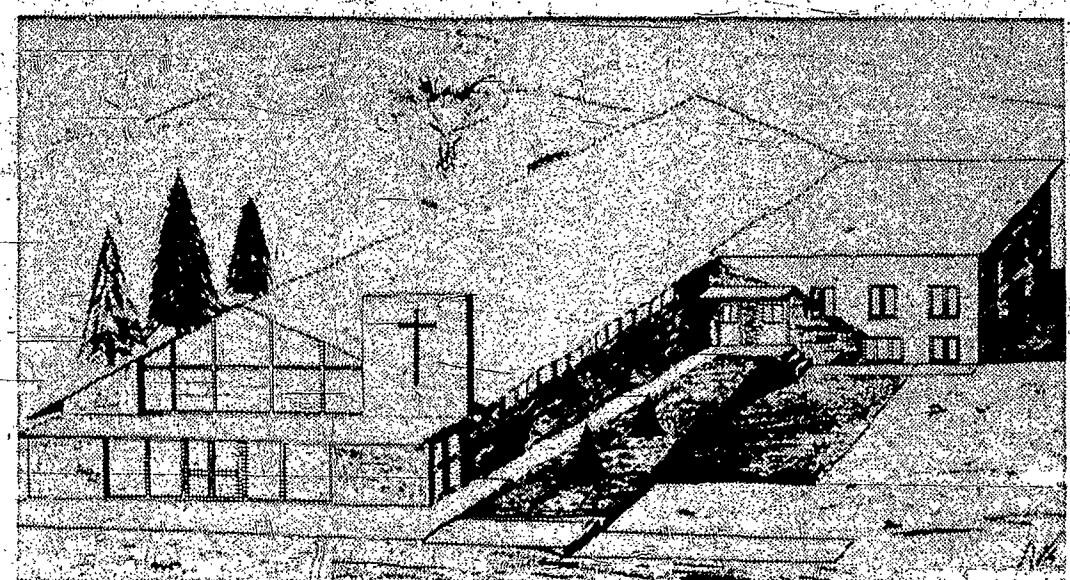

First St., Mr. Frey, member of the Steuben County Board of Supervisors and prominent in Democratic politics for many years, died Jan. 12, 1959, at Corning Hospital where he had been a patient for a week.
