



Bishops Seek Govt. Funds For Schools

London - (RNS) - A delegation of the Roman Catholic hier archy will meet here with Edu-cation Minister Geoffrey Lloyd on Feb. 2 to discuss the problem of increased government aid for the country's financially hardpressed Catholic schools.

On the previous day, special prayers will be offered in all the Catholic dioceses of England and Wales for the Catholic schools.

THE DISCUSSION between the bishop's delegation and the Education Minister will be an outcome of the recent Education White Paper which outlined ambitious school-building and reorganization plans for the years

Of particular interest to the Catholic and other denominational schools was a paragraph in the document which said: "The. government recognizes that the churches may need some further help if they are to play their full part (in the building expansion program), and discussions will oon be opened."

Of the 29,145 primary and secondary schools in Britain, 8,210 are run by the Church of England (Anglican) and 1,964 by the Catholic Church.
