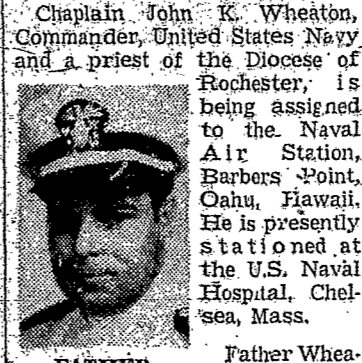
Funeral Rites For Father Dempsey Set

Funeral services for Rev. Edward Dempsey, a priest who served in the Diocese of Rochester for 19 years, will take place in Lafayette Diocese in Indiana. Father Dempsey, 51, died of a heart attack Jan. 27, 1959. He was chaplain of St. Joseph Conv. Motherhouse and Novitiate conducted by the Sisters of St. Joseph in Hipton, Ind. He left the Rochester diocese in August, 1953, because of ill health.

Born in Rochester, Father Dempsey was graduated from St. Andrew and St. Bernard's seminaries. He was ordained to the Holy Priesthood, June 10, 1932. After serving as an assistant at the Church of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Brookport from 1932 to 1934, he taught at Aquinas Institute from 1934 to 1937. He later received his master's degree from Niagara University.

From 1937 to 1940, he was assistant superintendent of schools, Diocese of Rochester. He was inducted into the Diocese of Lafayette, Indiana in 1953.

Father Wheaton Is Re-Assigned



Chaplain John K. Wheaton, Commander, United States Navy and a priest of the Diocese of Rochester, is being assigned to the Naval Air Station, Barbers Point, Oahu, Hawaii. He is presently a tattoo artist at the U.S. Naval Hospital, Chelsea, Mass.

Father Wheaton has served in the Navy since 1941 being the first diocesan priest to enlist in the Navy in World War II. He was stationed at Sampson Naval Training Center and prior to that was aboard the U.S.S. Helena which was sunk in the Battle of Kula Gulf. After the engagement Chaplain Wheaton was awarded the Purple Heart.

His new address will be Chaplain Office, Naval Air Station, Navy No. 14, c/o Fleet Post Office, San Francisco, Calif. He will report about the middle of May.
