

Pastors Report Total Coverage Renewals

Eighteen pastors have renewed the "total coverage" plan of the Courier Journal, early reports in the February circulation drive indicated this week.

Six of the eighteen reported an increase in the number of parishioners who will subscribe to the diocesan paper. "Total coverage" means all families of a parish receive the Courier Journal each week.

New subscriptions will begin with the April 3rd issue.

Subscription price remains at \$4.50, the same as the past three years, for a complete 52 weekly editions.

Pastors throughout the Diocese are currently tabulating results of circulation campaigns in their parishes. This week the following pastors reported these parish totals:

Our Lady of the Lake, King Ferry, 82 subscribers, for a gain of 20; **All Saints, Ludlowville**, 74 total, for a gain of 18; Rev. Frederick L. Walz is pastor of both churches.

St. Michael, Livonia Center, and **St. Mary, Honcove**, Rev. J. Joseph O'Connell, pastor, 138 subscribers (gain 11); **St. Mary, Dansville**, Rev. John M. Merklinger, 410 (gain 10).

St. Charles Borromeo, Elmira Heights, Rev. Joseph G. Merkley, 342 (total increase of 5).

St. Stephen, Geneva, Rev. Raymond P. Nolan, 1,018 total (gain 4) and **St. Plus, Cohocton**, Rev. Herbert L. Sturmer, 89 (up 11).








Better Than Tractors

Moral Principles Said U.S. Strength

PROVIDENCE, R.I. — A call for Americans to exhibit a clearer moral purpose was made here by U.S. Secretary of Labor James P. Mitchell.

He cautioned that unless the annual dinner of the Retreat League of Our Lady of Peace, the cabinet official said the great appeal that could be made to the uncommitted nations of the world is one based on moral principles.

"Our strength for forming opinion and exerting influence does not lie in technological might, but in the same deep wells of religious conviction and belief that have given America her soul," Mr. Mitchell said.
