High School Review

Students Prepare Exhibit

Students in the science department at Saint Agnes High School have been engaged for several months on extensive projects, as a prelude to the Diocesan-wide science fair to be held March 14.

More than life-size models of crystals, simple machines and parts of the human body have been constructed; results of plant and animal growth as affected by various conditions have been tabulated, and collections of everything from spores to fossils have been mounted and annotated.

Among the projects are a liver and gall bladder system constructed by junior biology students Kathleen Alderson and Kathleen McCorry. This model shows the flow of bile and uses actual gall stones and bile to do it. Judy Russer, a senior chemistry student has constructed a working model of the Frasch process demonstrating the actual method used in industry for the extraction of sulfur from underground beds, and Jacqueline Gauthier and Dorothy Beisheim, juniors, are showing how two pairs of guinea pigs respond to nutrient-deficient against normal diets.

All science projects will be displayed in the school gym on Feb. 26 and 27, at which time they will be judged. Gold medals will be awarded for the most outstanding of the projects. These, in turn, will be entered at the science fair.
