McQuaid Students Capture Earthquakes, Electrons

McQuaid Jesuit High school Science Club members put two highly complex machines into operation this week.
Their self-built seismograph for recording earthquakes was put through its first tests on Monday and two days later an electronic pulse circuit blinked its record of possible radio-active fall out in a snowstorm.
The seismograph stands in the dimly lighted cellar atop a concrete slab resting on bed rock. Earthquakes any place in the world will be recorded on a photographic paper on a rotating drum. Over 20 students have worked on the project under the direction of Mr. Roy Drake, Jesuit scholastic from New Jersey, science instructor at the school.

The pulse counter, a thousand dollar mechanism built by two science students for a total cost of \$40, can calculate the amount of radio-active fallout which occurs following an atomic explosion or other similar radio-active release.
The counter can record up to 20,000 pulses a second and can also serve as an electronic clock accurate to 1/1000 of a second.
Local industries have aided the students in obtaining parts needed for the seismograph and counter and the boys have used their ingenuity to make other essential parts to keep costs to a minimum.

graduate nurse, she received her nursing training at the Rochester General Hospital. She worked with the Tuberculosis Association, the Health Association, Lewis Street Center and the Public Health Office. Under the auspices of the Health Office, she organized a program of pre-natal nursing. She was appointed Superintendent of School Nurses in Rochester in 1917.
She began her career in Catholic social work and Catholic action which is probably without parallel in the Catholic Charities movement. Under her leadership, Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Rochester developed from a small group of volunteers into a whole group of agencies including casework and group service for the Catholics of Rochester. She was recognized as one of the leading workers in the field.
Miss D'Olier continued her association until her retirement in July 1952. She organized the first school of nursing in Greece (Athens). She organized the first program of Public Health Nursing and established 13 infant welfare and prenatal centers in Puerto Rico.

NEIL PAPPALARDO, 52, and **PAUL MCAVINEY**, 17, of 18 children, was one of the founders of the Holy Name Society of Mount Carmel Church, Ontario Street. He is a past commander of the Knights of St. John, a member of the Nocturnal Adoration Society and the Laymen's Retreat League. Mr. D'Amico is a member of the Mt. Carmel Ecce Homo Society and a trustee of the church. He is a former supervisor of the 18th Ward and a member of the Board of Directors of the Lewis Street Settlement House.
He was active in the parish appeal for funds for a new school. After a disastrous school fire several years ago, he was instrumental in cleaning up the debris and initiating another drive for its reconstruction.
