Fr. John Hayes Named Chaplain Of Hibernians

The Rev. John S. Hayes, pastor of St. Patrick's Church, Elmira, has assumed the duties of chaplain for the Msgr. John J. Lee Division, Chemung County No. 1, Ancient Order of Hibernians.

Father Hayes becomes the first pastor to serve in this post, since the division's founding Feb. 15, 1855.

WHILE ASSIGNED to churches in Rochester, Father Hayes was a member of a Monroe County division of the Order.

He was chaplain of the Veterans Administration Center at Bath prior to his appointment at St. Patrick's four months ago.

He joined the Rochester division shortly after his ordination Feb. 15, 1910.

Previously he was an assistant pastor at four Rochester churches including the Sacred Heart Cathedral.

IN WORLD WAR II, Father Hayes was the Catholic Chaplain in the 183rd Field Artillery Group of General George Patton's Third Army.

He attained the rank of major, while earning the Bronze Star and four battle stars, including one for the Ardennes Campaign (The Battle of the Bulge).

ND Yearbook Takes Honors

Notre Dame's year book, *Credo*, received All-Catholic honors from the Catholic Press Association and a Medalist rating from the Columbia Scholastic Press Association. It was announced this week. These are the highest awards that are given for yearbook publications.

IN THE CRITIQUE issued by Columbia the 1958 *Credo* received 985 points out of a possible 1000. The book, dedicated to Pope Pius XII, contained pertinent quotations throughout.

Theme of "stepping into the light of the world" was so blended with the school's motto "Ego Sum Lux Mundi" that full credit was given the idea of the book.

Credits were deducted on editorial coverage and photography. The colored pictures, however, were highly commended.

Noted Jesuit Scholar To Highlight Dinner

A capacity audience at the Twenty-Ninth Anniversary Dinner of Elmira's Catholic Family Service will hear an internationally known orator, the Very Reverend Martin C. D'Arcy, S.J., of England and Washington, D. C. on Sunday, March 1 at 7 p.m. in the Mark Twain Hotel.

Father D'Arcy who is presently on the faculty of Georgetown University in Washington is also giving a course in Philosophy at Cornell University. He was the Master of Campion Hall at Oxford University from 1933-1945, the Provincial of the English Province of the Society of Jesus from 1945 to 1950, and visiting Professor of Philosophy at Georgetown University since 1950.

HIS PUBLICATIONS include more than fifteen books, among which are *The Spirit of Charity*, *Thomas Aquinas, The Mind and Heart of Love*, *The Meeting of Love and Knowledge and Communism and Christianity*.

Dr. James A. Mark is general chairman for the fourth consecutive year and his assistant-chairmen are Rev. Leonard J. Kujawski and Rev. Joseph P. Hogan of St. Casimir's Church and Notre Dame High School, respectively.

Infirmiry Drive Nears \$100,000 In Elmira

Reports of the campaign Chairmen in the four Elmira parishes participating in the Infirmiry-Novitate Appeal of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Rochester revealed the following totals to date on Feb. 17:

THE ABOVE figures represent a total of \$96,362.50 so far in Elmira's effort toward the Sisters' Appeal for an infirmiry and additional facilities for the novices.

These novices are being prepared to staff schools and institutions in the diocese, conducted by the Sisters of St. Joseph. The community numbering more than 900 religious is in its 105th year of service in the Diocese of Rochester.
