Dansville Fund Drive Tops Goal

Dansville — The two-parish, city-wide fund drive to build a new Guardian Angels parochial school has soared over its goal of \$175,000. William G. Blum, chairman, announced this week.

The proposed school will cost an approximate \$300,000 and provide combined facilities for pupils of both parishes now attending classes in separate buildings.

Final report will be made March 6th.

Pledges and gifts are still being turned in. In the campaign, Mr. Blum stated, but preliminary tallies indicate the goal has been met.

He attributed the drive's success to the generosity of parishioners of St. Mary's and St. Patrick's Churches, local industries and citizens of the community who have contributed to the campaign.

Rev. John O'Donnell, pastor of St. Patrick's, and Rev. John Merklinger, pastor of St. Mary's, said the campaign assures construction of the new school.

After reading 1,000 intimate autobiographies of college students, psychologists Paul Landis concluded: "The young person of today faces more hard problems in his first 20 years than his grandparents faced in a life time."

Comparisons of this sort are difficult to make, but I share his opinion because of the rapid changes of our times.

It is getting so that some brides are still looking when walking down the aisle and wondering if they couldn't have done better. They are rushed, and frantic, and often catapulted into physical intimacy with half strangers.

Over concerned with what others think, some believe they just have to get married and that's that. They sit up with a husband when he is sick and put up with him the rest of the time and smile the moon itself is brighter than many a young lover beneath it.

The background of this whole drama is a necessary part of the general picture. Young people now have to find their own mates under social and geographical mobility, the like of which history has never seen.

Over 33 million people change addresses annually in the U.S. Much of the mobility is due to job changing. Some of it is just "milling around." Much of it is a game of "musical chairs" but they are moving.

Parents no longer know the family background of the young people who date another — mating is becoming almost a matter of chance. Young people find one another by the mere accident of being in the same place at the same time.

Romance in that way is an illusion. Were not a particular person accidentally at hand an almost identical passion would probably have been

China Envoy Assigned To Ireland

Vatican City — (NC) — Archbishop Antonio Riberi, Apostolic Internuncio to China who was ousted by the Reds in 1951, has been named Apostolic Nuncio to Ireland.

Archbishop Riberi's new assignment fills a most left vacant by the death, two months ago, of Archbishop Albertina Legnani.

Like his predecessor the 61-year-old new Nuncio to Ireland is a native of Monte Carlo, Monaco. He is also a veteran of diplomatic service in the Irish capital, having served at the nunciature in Dublin from 1930 to 1934.

Archbishop Riberi became the Vatican's first diplomatic representative accredited to a Far Eastern government when he was named Internuncio to China on July 6, 1946.

Five years later he was expelled by the Chinese communists, after two months spent under close house arrest in the city of Nanking.

The prelate then established himself at the capital of the Nationalist-held island of Formosa, and was still living in Taipei at the time of the announcement of his transfer to Ireland.

Rome Synod Preparation Under Way

Rome — (NC) — Work to organize the Rome diocesan synod announced by Pope John XXIII on Jan. 25 is already under way, it was revealed here.

An official announcement of the establishment of a special commission to prepare the meeting is expected soon.

THE COMMISSION will most likely be presided over by Archbishop Luigi Traglia, Vicar-General of Rome, and will be composed of pastors and priests at work in the various sections of the Rome-diocese.

Its task will be to draw up the agenda for the synod, which will have a major importance aside from being one of the for in Rome's history, the meeting is expected to set the pattern for legislation in other sections throughout the world.

The synod was one of three major projects announced by the Pope on January 25 during a visit to the Basilica of St. Paul outside the Walls.

The two other projects were the convocation of an ecumenical council of the Church, and the modernization of the Church's Code of Canon Law.

The diocesan synod will also serve as a distant preparation for the ecumenical council, which is expected to convene in about two years and bring some 1,500 prelates from throughout the world to Rome.

When You Say Amen

(Pronounced: Ah-men)

An instruction from the Vatican's Congregation of Rites issued this past September directs Catholics to make the response to the priest at Mass.

The fact that these responses are to be made in Latin has prompted many people to ask a double question. "How do you pronounce these words and what do they mean?"

This article is the first in a series which will try to answer that question.

The easiest of all the responses is the one-word reply — Amen.

To begin with, it isn't Latin. It's Hebrew.

St. Augustine, and later the Council of Trent, said the Church uses this word in its prayers because our Lord Himself used it so frequently.

St. Paul tells us that the lay people said the Amen to show they agreed with the prayers of the priest at the altar (1 Cor. 14:16).

In its original Hebrew form, Amen conveyed the idea of strengthening or confirming.

As the presiding officer at a business meeting today asks those who agree with him to say "aye," so in the religious gatherings of the ancient Jews and early Christians the people gave their assent by saying Amen.

The custom was so well known that even the pagan executioner of St. Polycarp waited for the saint to finish his prayer and say the Amen before performing his gruesome task way back in the year 155.

The "Great Amen" mentioned in the musical composition "The Lost Chord" refers to the conclusion of the Canon prayers just before the Pater Noster.

After the long, silent moments, during which bread and wine are changed into our Lord's Body and Blood, the priest concludes with the doxology giving "all praise to God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, forever and ever." The final words he says aloud and the people give their whole-hearted ratification of his solemn rite by this "Great Amen."

The congregation also voices its Amen at the conclusion of the Collect, Offertory, Postcommunion, and Blessing. The word should be said firmly, devoutly.

Circulation Gains Reported

Convert Minister Dies At Fatima

Fatima, (NC) — Lawrence Harvey, former Anglican clergyman who for the past decade has concentrated on spreading the message of Our Lady of Fatima, died in the Sanctuary Hospice here Feb. 8 at the age of 72.

A young chaplain with the British forces in World War I, Mr. Harvey was recalled by his superiors for preaching devotion to the Blessed Virgin and forming a Marian confraternity for Protestant soldiers.

The Oxford-educated clergyman was received into the Catholic Church in 1919. He devoted his life thereafter to spreading devotion to the Mother of God, and his own father, a Church of England clergyman like himself, became a Catholic in 1928.

Madame de Gaulle Visits Lourdes

Paris — (RNS) — Madame Charles de Gaulle, wife of the French President, slipped away from her husband's party during a tour of southwest France and making a personal visit to the shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes.

She knelt in prayer at the grotto and later visited the underground Basilica of St. Pius X, dedicated during the Centenary anniversary of the apparitions of the Blessed Virgin to St. Bernadette Soubirous at Lourdes.
