

Mission Orders Authorized To Make Appeals In Diocese

Bishop James E. Kearney has given permission to twenty-eight mission societies to appeal in this diocese for their particular mission needs. This is in accord with the Missionary Cooperation Plan which has been in existence in the diocese for the past twenty-three years.

EACH PARISH has one particular appeal in addition to the general world-wide mission appeal sponsored by the Society for the Propagation of the Faith.

Two hundred forty-five applications were received this year for participation in the Plan. The mission cause and the urgency of its needs are presented to the people of the parishes by men who speak from personal experience and a zeal which prompted them to dedicate their lives to missionary work.

GOD LOVE YOU!

HIS HOLINESS Pope John XXIII has just published the text of a speech which Pope Pius XII was preparing when he died, in which he called Hitler, "Nero." He was bidding man look back and see how the persecutions at the beginning of Christianity have returned upon the world. The idea is worth following through. The persecutions of Nero were as nothing compared to the persecutions of today both in quantity and intensity. Out of 8,500 foreign missionaries in China ten years ago, less than ten are left today. Communism now owns one third of the earth while 37 out of every 100 people are under its domination.

THE WISE UNIVERSAL Doctor of the Church, St. Thomas Aquinas said that the age of the anti-Christ would be ushered into the world through a political power; that the persecutions in early Rome were but the rehearsals of persecutions of latter days. Cardinal Newman in 1871 said that "the lowest class which is very great in numbers, and unbelieving, will rise up out of the depths of our modern cities and be the scourge of God." In 1842 Heine, the famous German writer wrote "The future smells of Russian leather, blood godlessness and many whippings. I should advise our grandchildren to be born with very thick skin on their backs."

OUR LORD CALLED the Devil "The Prince of the World." The Book of the Apocalypse speaks of the anti-Christ as a kind of mystical body opposite in character and ideals to the Church, the mystical Body of Christ. The anti-Christ will come to power through a tremendous economic and political organization in which no one will be allowed to buy or sell unless he is marked with the sign of the Beast. He will set up a rule such as exists now in China and behind the Iron Curtain from which there is no place to emigrate, no road of escape. There will be but one office, one factory, one absolute center of power.

POPE PIUS XII called the Church under Communism "The Church of Silence" because its organized voice could not be heard through the Iron Curtain. But inside both the Iron Curtain and the Bamboo Curtain the Church is the "Church of Martyrs." There is no other alternative to Communism.

THE PROPAGATION of the Faith, which like a giant strides both the world which is yet free and the world which is in chains knows well this present and awful situation. We beg those whose thoughts are confined to small areas like a home, a city, a state, a nation to begin to think of and see the world as it is; to make themselves one with Christ crucified in China and Northern Vietnam; to live out the Mass by sacrificing luxuries that have become necessities, and in their charities, as the Holy Father said, to think first and principally, of him. To the Holy Father above all falls the burden of all the missions of the world.
