"UP PERISCOPE" sneaks into the Palace Theater this week offering for the WHOLE FAMILY a tale of adventure, under water style.

James Garner plays Bret Maverick in the television western of the same name, is the star of this World War II yarn. Wasn't it Horace Greeley who said, "Go West, young man?" Well, Maverick must have heard him because he finds himself "somewhere in the South Pacific." (Maybe the trolley forgot to stop.)

GARNER, Navy Lieutenant, is romanced by Andra Martin who is under orders from Naval Intelligence to determine his fitness for a vital mission. You might be able to guess that he passed the test or we would be seeing a lot of the Pacific ocean for the 111 minutes of the film. Edmund O'Brien is the Captain of the Submarine Barracuda, who is misunderstood by his men because he goes strictly by the book. Alan Hale gives a touch of comedy to the film as the Ensign liked by Hawaiian beauties.


