## 14 Schools To Compete For Debating Awards

Eighteenth Annual Aquinas Institute Invitational Debate Tournament will be held by the Aquinas Society of Forensic Arts at Aquinas, tomorrow, Feb. 28.

The topic that will be debated is RESOLUTION: That membership in a labor organization as a condition of employment should be illegal.

Observers are expected from Greece Central School and other area schools interested in starting debating teams. Madison High School, Monroe High School, and Irondequoit High School have been invited.
