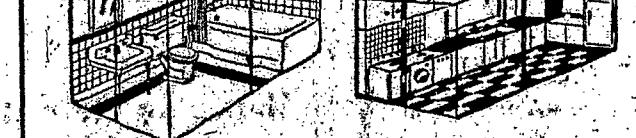

CSMC Sponsors Workshop Panel

"To meet the challenge of Communism, America must devote the best effort to make Youth responsible, conscious of obligations and eager to be good citizens."

This statement came from a member of Workshop on Communism panel held at Nazareth Academy under the sponsorship of the Catholic Students Mission Crusade of Aquinas and Nazareth.

The object of the workshop was to fight Communism by exploring its philosophy, morality, economics and activities of the party in the present day.

PANEL MEMBERS included: the Rev. T. A. O'Reilly, C.S.B., moderator; Sandra Furstoss, student chairman; Thomas Dillon, Brian Gibson, Graydon Vadas, Aquinas members of the mission unit; Bonnie Bilecki, Marie Leccese, and Elaine Opitz, Nazareth.

"Treating the anti-religious aspect of Communism, the panel held that the aim of Communism is the utter elimination of all religion from the heart, mind and soul of man. It teaches the people that they must accept whatever tyranny and brutality necessary to the change in government. It reduces them to the level of animals by forcing them to act as purely material beings."

FROM THIS THE discussion considered the political significance of Communism as a threat to our system of democracy based on the concept of rights as a free individual invested with rights based on the personal dignity of the individual. They stated that politically Communism may be met by choosing candidates in elections on the basis of moral worth.

Students were offered a suggestion for bringing about the most effective campaign against the evil. It is the advice given by the Blessed Virgin Mary: prayer and penance.

National Science Group Approves Fisher Chapter

St. John Fisher College was chosen this week for the establishment of a chapter of the National Social Science Honor Society, Pi Gamma Mu. This information was announced by Dr. Edward F. Stauber, Assistant Professor of Economics at the college.

Approval of its application for a chapter in Pi Gamma Mu places St. John Fisher College in the company of some of the nation's leading institutions of higher learning.

The purpose of Pi Gamma Mu is to improve scholarship in the social sciences and to inspire social service to humanity by an intelligent approach to the solution of social problems.

THE PRIVILEGE of membership is granted to those who have shown unusual interest and aptitude in the study of such sciences. Other universities and colleges affiliated with the National Social Science Honor Society include: the University of Pennsylvania, University of California, Catholic University of America, College of William and Mary, Georgetown University, University of Toronto and such nearby colleges as Hobart and LeRoyne.

Pi Gamma Mu was founded at the College of William and Mary, the birthplace of Phi Beta Kappa, in 1924 and now has over one hundred active chapters in accredited colleges and universities.

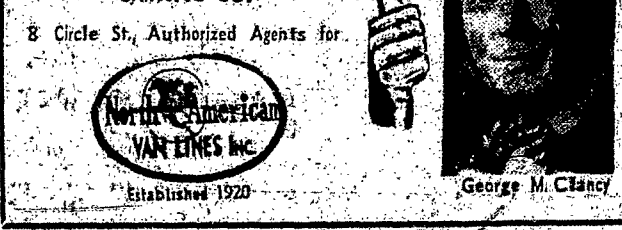
COLLEGE CHAPTERS may be established only in institutions of higher learning which are fully accredited and which have a sufficient number of well-trained faculty members, adequate library facilities, and sound curricula to offer students training in the social sciences.

St. John Fisher College chapter has been designated "New York Phi" under the Chancellor of the Eastern Region. Installation will be late in March by the Governor of the New York Province, Dr. John G. VanDeusen of Hobart and William Smith Colleges.

DR. EDWARD F. STAUBER, Assistant Professor of Economics at St. John Fisher College is responsible for establishing this new chapter of Pi Gamma Mu. He also founded the "New York Phi" chapter in LeMoyne College. Before coming to Fisher College, Dr. Stauber taught at Georgetown University, Catholic University of America, and LeMoyne College. He is a graduate of Niagara University, received his M.A., Ph.D. from the Catholic University, and his M.S. from Syracuse University.
