Born on April 28, 1869, she oined the Carmelite convent of Lisieux in 1894, shortly after her father's death. She re-mained in the world to take a care of her father after her sisters had entered reli-

One of them became a nun of the Visitation Order, while the other four joined the Car-

Among them was St. Therese of Lisieux, also known as the Little Flower of Jesus, who died at the age of 24 on September 30, 1897, and was later acclaimed by Pope Pius X -himself destined for sainthood -as "the greatest saint of nodern times."

Sister Genevieve also heid the distinction of having scenfuture pope attend caremonies marking her golden jubilee as a Religious.






