

**Prelate Says**

# Neutrality A Crime

Dallas — (NC) — "Neutrality in the face of international crime is itself a crime," Archbishop Robert E. Lucey of San Antonio told the Holy Name Society convention here.

Pope Plus XII, condemned that wretched foreign policy which he called apathetic neutrality," the Archbishop said in his sermon in Sacred Heart cathedral.

"The Holy Father pointed out that sometimes small nations may practice neutrality in the midst of armed conflict because any other policy would be suicide. But this does not apply to the great powers. They must defend justice in order that justice may survive. Human freedom is indivisible. If it is destroyed anywhere, it is injured everywhere."

The Archbishop, who is a vice president of the Catholic Association for International Peace, preached at a Mass which was offered by Bishop Thomas K. Gorman of Dallas. Port Worth, for members of the Church who are suffering behind the Iron and Bamboo Curtains. Among those in attendance was Charles Malik, former Lebanese foreign minister and now president of the United Nations General Assembly.

THE ARCHBISHOP said that "World War II finally taught our leaders and some of our people that isolation doesn't pay."

## Prelate Cites State's Duty To Parents

Jefferson City — (NC) — An essential flaw in the "state aid to parochial school" controversy is the overlooking of a precise definition of the mutually sustaining roles of parents and the state, Bishop Joseph M. Marling, C.P.S.S. of Jefferson City said here.

The Bishop, speaking at the 34th anniversary Communion breakfast of the Glennon Circle Daughters of Isabella, summarized his position this way: By the law of nature and the Constitution of the United States, Catholic parents have the right to send their children to parochial schools. The state must assist parents and further their efforts in their role as basic educators of their children.

If the state refuses, the Bishop continued, to aid those parents who choose a parochial school which fully meets state standards, then the state plainly penalizes parents for their religious belief and for making a free selection.

## \$1,000 Willed To Seminary

A sum of \$1,000 was bequeathed to St. Bernard's Seminary of which his deceased son was a graduate by William J. Morgan, 83, a retired machinist, probate of his will before surrogate Michael L. Rogers disclosed.

Other bequests included \$100 each for Masses left to four priests and \$100 for Holy Sepulchre Cemetery.

Mr. Morgan who died Jan. 28 was the father of the Rev. Lester M. Morgan who died in 1935 and was a member of the Aquinas Institute faculty. The estate was estimated at \$7000. Louis N. Roche is the estate's attorney and its executor.

## Trappist In Exile Marks Anniversary

Hong Kong — (NC) — A Chinese Trappist monk whose courage and leadership under Communist persecution kept intact the Cistercian Order in China celebrated his silver jubilee of ordination here.

Father Paulinus Lee, Prior of the Cistercian Monastery of Our Lady of Llesse on nearby Lantau Island, marked the occasion with a Solemn Mass attended by a large group of priests and laymen from Hong Kong who traveled to the monastery by ferry to pay honor to the heroic monk.

FATHER LEE was ordained in 1934 in the Monastery of Our Lady of Consolation at Yang Xia Ping in mainland China. Later he was appointed Prior of the Monastery of Our Lady of Llesse in Chengting. In 1947 the communists forced the monks to leave the Chengting monastery.

They went to Szechuan Province, but two years later the monks were forced to disperse and leave China.

Father Lee took them to North America, where they remained in Canada and the United States for two years while he traveled in search of a place to preserve the continuity of Trappist life in China.

A promising site was located on Lantau Island, a few miles south of Hong Kong, where Father Lee found a year-round source of water. Previous at-

tempts to find water to help in the development of the island had failed.

In 1951 Father Lee, with his small band of monks from North America, began the construction of a small chapel and dormitory. At the same time they cultivated the land by diverting the water from the top of a high hill to the fields below.

By the end of 1952 so much progress had been made that the Abbot-General of the Cistercians on a visit here approved the canonical erection of the monastery. The monastery was formally opened in February, 1956, by Sir Alexander Grimham, then governor of Hong Kong.
