native of Loudon County, Va., and through his mother, Mary Boone Patterson, a relative of Daniel Boone, was raised in Northumberland County, Pa., and became a skilled hunter and woodsman.

In the Revolution, he fought in the battle of Freeland's Fort (1779) and participated in the Sullivan = Clinton Campaign, When Capt. Charles William-son opened the Genesee Country after the Revolution, Patterson guided him in his search for a shortcut via the West Branch of the Suspuehanna and he Tioga River.

BECAUSE HIS career cpltomizes the sort of pioneer who made America what it is, the Historical-Society_sponsored_in the State Legislature a Bill officially to designate the new span as "Benjamin Patterson Bridge." Backed by other citizens, the bill passed both

houses in the spring of 1958. It became a law on April 10 when signed by Governor Harriman.
