1/2 t. mayonnaise

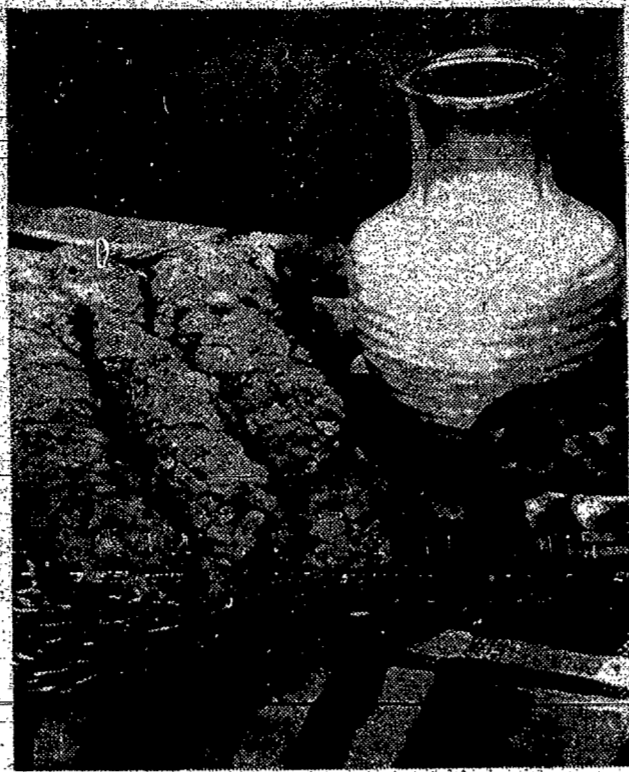

Peanut-Oatmeal Cookies — a tasty treat!

Cream shortening, add sugars and blend well. Add vanilla and eggs. Sift flour and soda. Stir into first mixture with rolled oats. Add peanuts. Form dough into small balls, place on ungreased cookie sheet. Flatten slightly. Bake at 425 degrees about 7 minutes. Store in tightly covered container. Makes 6 dozen.

If your children like peanut butter sandwiches, you'll be happy to learn that peanuts are a good source of protein and are also an excellent source of food energy... that's important for growing youngsters. HERE IS A SALAD that youngsters will like; Drain 1 can (14 ounces) crushed pineapple; mix it with 1/2 c. finely diced celery and 1 c. grated carrot. Use just enough mayonnaise to moisten. Serve on crisp lettuce and sprinkle with chopped peanuts. Will serve 4.

Back to eggs for a moment; SCRAMBLED EGGS for breakfast or lunch are delicious if properly prepared. The secret is to cook them over low heat and only until they are cooked and are still moist. For the creamiest scrambled eggs ever, ever try adding Dairy Sour Cream or Dairy Dressing, about 1 T. for each egg you are scrambling. Beat eggs slightly, add seasonings and Sour Cream.

Action-Packed Race

Mayo Team Leads

Just when it looked like Cork, the year-long Hibernian Bowling League leader, had the loop crown cinched, last week's action cut its advantage from eight to four points.

Upstart Down, a second-division regular most of the way, came up with its best effort, to capture four points from the leaders.

CAPTAIN BILL O'Leary and anchor-man Jim Powell powered the Downers, each throwing a 100 game. O'Leary posted 100-171-121 — 482 and Powell racked up 100-190-150 — 490.

The 1762-pin total was Down's high point of the campaign. The middle game 635 was tops, too.

Cork wasn't close in any of the contests, finishing with 1570. "Archer" Tom Sullivan's 159 was the best effort.

Meanwhile, second-place Clare took advantage of the situation, matching Down's total to the pin, as the Claremen sank cellar-dwelling Mayo in three games.

MAYO STAYED with Clare most of the way, pushing Clare to a final-game 601, to win by 13 pins.

Jerry Hogan posted 158-199-156 — 515 and Tim Connelly had 187-124-180 — 491 for Clare. Dave O'Herron paced Mayo with a 182 game.
