

# Mass, Activities Honor Ireland's Famous Patron

FRIDAY, MARCH 13, 1950

Ireland's Saint and Apostle will be honored on the Feast Day, Tuesday, March 17 with religious observance, dinners and other festivities. Pontifical Mass will be sung by Bishop Kearney at St. Patrick Church, Plymouth Ave. North at Brown St. at 10 a.m.



Bishop Kearney will be assisted by Rt. Rev. Monsignor Wilfred T. Craugh, Archpriest; Rev. Roy B. Morphy, Deacon; Rev. George S. Wood, Subdeacon; Very Rev. Ernest P. Magee, C.S.B. and Rev. Michael J. Tydings, Assistants at the Throne; Rev. Edward J. McAuff, Master of Ceremonies; Rev. Paul J. McCarthy, S.J., Subdeacon Cross Bearer. Minor offices will be taken by St. Andrew's Seminary.

Panegyric at the Mass will be preached by Monsignor Aloysius Cogan, pastor of St. Columba Church, Chester, N. Y. Monsignor Cogan is widely known in the New York archdiocese as having visited Rochester on several other occasions.

MASS WILL be sung by the student choir of St. Andrew's Seminary.

Members of the Ancient Order of Hibernians and Auxiliary, Knights of Equity, Friendly Sons of St. Patrick, Daughters of Erin, and other organizations including Knights of Columbus will attend.

Festivities in the evening will be featured by the 34th annual banquet of the Knights of Equity to take place at 7 p.m. in Powers Hotel with Bishop Kearney as guest of honor, according to Kenneth T. Power, sir knight.

IBERNIANS and friends will open their feast observance on Sunday, March 15 at Mass and Communion in Old St. Mary Church, South St. at 9:30 a.m. according to Walter Anderson, county president. Immediately after the Mass, chaplains and Hibernian officers will lead a parade to the Hibernian Club, 48 Alexander St. where a Continental Breakfast will be served.

Robert Kelly and Sean Curran are Parade marshals. Memorial Post, American Legion Band will march along with the delegations from the Rochester Harps, G. A. A. and Police and Fire Bureaus. Sunday evening a corned beef and cabbage supper will be served in the Hibernian Club for members and friends followed by entertainment and dancing.

The Hibernians' celebration will take place in Manger Hotel, Tuesday, March 17 with dancing and entertainment in the evening. Vic Sweet's orchestra will play for dancing.
