William Heindl Rites Offered At Lourdes

Funeral Mass for William A. Heindl, former head of the printing firm established by his father in 1873 was offered in Our Lady of Lourdes Church, Tuesday, March 10.

Mr. Heindl was a member of the executive committee of the old Profit Savings and Loan Association, a forerunner of the First Federal Savings and Loan Association.

A life member of Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus, he was a member of the Alhambra and was active in these organizations at one time. He also belonged to the Rochester Lodge of Elks and Rochester Turners.

He joined the Heindl and Son, Inc., firm in 1907 and became its president in 1916. He retired in 1937.

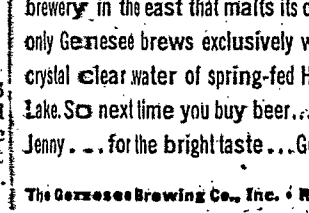

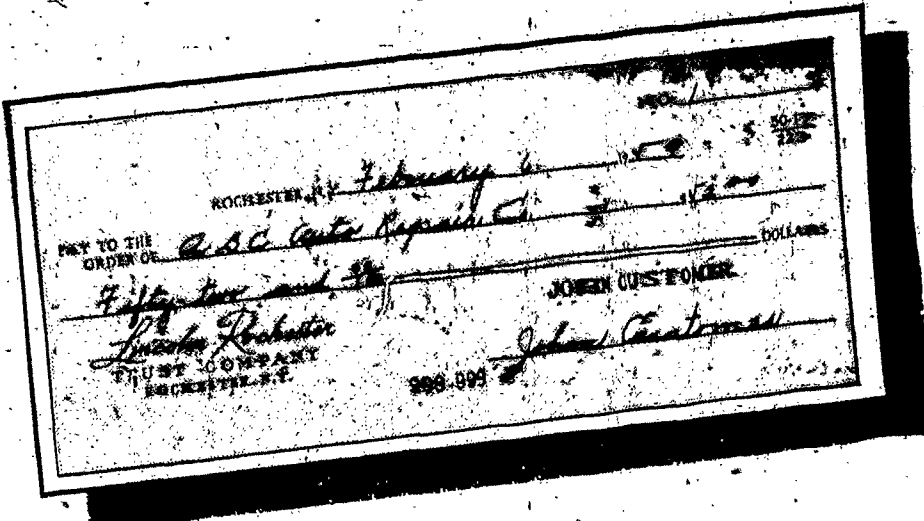
