

2,500 See Science Fair At McQuaid

A total of 300 exhibits from forty-three parochial schools and eight high schools of the Rochester Diocese registered yesterday for the annual Science Fair at McQuaid Jesuit High School last Saturday.

The impressive array of exhibits on display before some 2,500 guests and visitors to the Diocesan Science Fair held at McQuaid Jesuit High School last weekend illustrated in vivid fashion the interest of Catholic schools of the area in the space age and the many varied impacts science has had on our times.

The Fair, held under the auspices of the Diocese and Monsignor Charles V. Boyle, diocesan superintendent of schools, was managed by Mr. Roy A. Drake, S.T., physics instructor at McQuaid and a committee of students from McQuaid Jesuit High School.

The flow of exhibits and exhibitors filled the gymnasium, lower corridor display rooms and physics and chemistry laboratories of the school long before the 10 a.m. opening time. A steady stream of visitors viewed the work of the young scientists until 4 p.m.

A distinguished panel of judges inspected the exhibits during the course of the afternoon and awarded first places to Richard Friday of Aquinas Institute in the Chemistry field for his work on the "Industrial Process of Producing Chromium"; to the group from St. Agnes High School for their project in Biology in New York State; to Carol Smith and Gail Wegman of St. Agnes for their individual project on "The Life of the Worm"; to the group from McQuaid for their Seismograph Station, in the Physics category; to Nell Pappalardo and Paul McAvinney of McQuaid for their "Lab Equipment for Analysis of Radioactive Decay" in the Individual Physics projects class.

In the General Science class, David Runt of St. Andrew's Seminary won first place for his exhibit of a six-inch reflecting telescope. A tie in the Grammar School Division was registered between Frank Marciore of Holy Family Grammar School for his exhibit of a rocket and Thomas Sable of St. Stanislaus School for his project on Lunar Photography.

First place award for group exhibit was awarded to the eighth grade of St. Augustine School for their exhibit on "Certain Chemicals and Reactions on Plants".

Other winners included: Angela Foster, St. Agnes; Gregory Hibel, Aquinas; Thomas Barker, McQuaid; William Ims, Aquinas; and Thomas Kohler, Our Lady of Lourdes.
