### Dr. Muckle, Canada Priest Dies At 67

Rev. Dr. William D. Muckle, Pastor of Our Lady of Lourdes Church, Toronto, Canada, died suddenly of a heart attack on March 12 at Hollywood, Florida where he had gone for a short vacation.

Funeral services were held at 10 a.m. on Wednesday, March 18, at Our Lady of Lourdes Church, Toronto. The body will be brought to Penn Yan and placed in a vault. Burial will take place later in the family plot in St. Michael's Cemetery.

A Requiem Mass for Dr. Muckle was offered in St. Theresa Church, Stanley, yesterday (Thursday) morning. Rev. George Weinmann, pastor of St. Philip Neri Church, Rochester, gave the eulogy.

DR. MUCKLE is survived by three brothers: Rev. Charles E. Muckle, pastor of St. Agnes Church, Avon; Rev. Joseph T. Muckle, C.S.B., a member of the staff of the Pontifical Institute of Medieval Studies, Toronto; Andrew Muckle of Stanley, N.Y.; and three sisters: Sister Mary Charles of the Sisters of Mercy, Rochester; Mrs. John E. McWilliams and Mrs. George D. McWilliams of Stanley; and seven nieces.

A brother, Leo Muckle, former Assistant State Farm Bureau Agent at Penn Yan, died in 1945, and Rev. John F. Muckle, founder and pastor of St. Thomas Church, Irondequoit, the oldest of the family, died December 15, 1958.

Dr. Muckle, born in 1891, was the first and only Catholic priest born in the township of Potter, Yates County, a native son of Thomas Muckle, a native of Middlesex, and Margaret Delaney of Penn Yan, who came from Queens County, Ireland, with her family at an early age.

The priest attended the district grade schools of the township until his parents moved to Stanley, Ontario County, N.Y., in 1903. His classical studies were made at St. Michael's College Toronto, and St. Anselm Seminary, Rochester. He made his philosophy course at St. Bernard's Seminary, Rochester.

On completion of his theological studies at St. Augustine Seminary, Toronto, he was ordained in December, 1917 at St. Michael's Cathedral for the Archdiocese of Toronto.

DURING THE early years of his priesthood he served as assistant pastor at St. Cecilia's, St. Ann's and St. John's parishes, Toronto. He then attended the Canadian College in Rome, Italy for postgraduate work in canon law for one year, at the completion of which he received his Doctorate in Canon Law.

On his return to Toronto, he was appointed bursar of St. Augustine's Seminary, Toronto, and continued in that position until he was appointed rector of St. Michael's Cathedral, Toronto. Thereafter he was pastor of St. John Chrysostom's Parish, Newmarket, Ontario, for some years and came back to Toronto as pastor of Our Lady of Lourdes Church in 1946, which position he occupied at the time of his death.

IN ADDITION to his regular parish activities he took an active interest in civic affairs. He was chaplain of the Toronto Council of the Knights of Columbus, and for some years was Diocesan representative of the Health League of Canada. He served as part time chaplain of Canadian Forces while in Newmarket during World War II.

Father William Muckle is known to many Rochesterians who visited the Shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes in Toronto on pilgrimages.

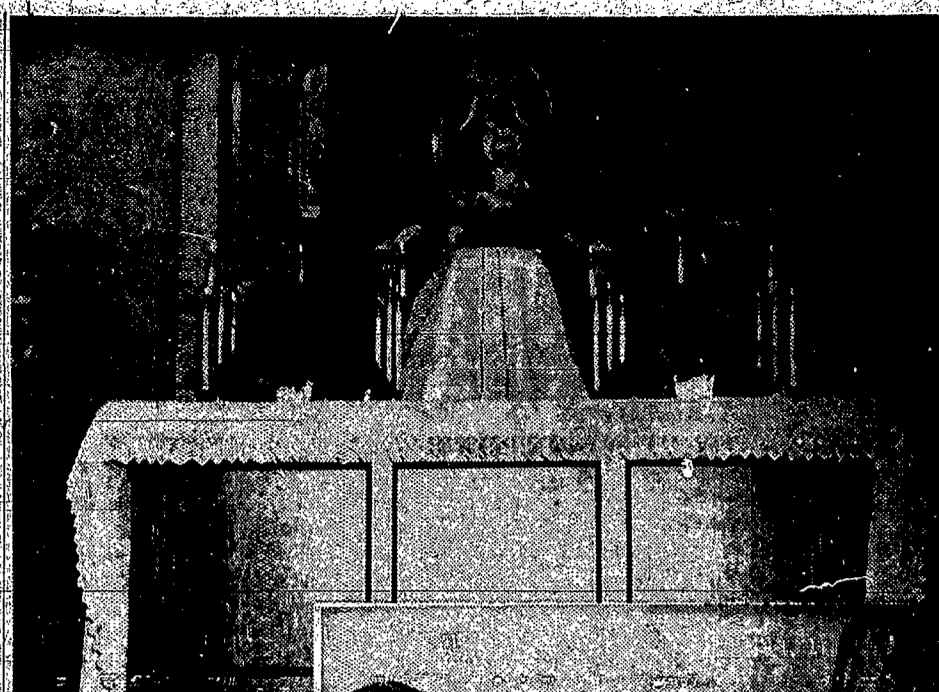
