

## Guidance Program Listed At College

A Vocational Guidance Exhibit designed especially for Nazareth College women by Mrs. Anne Matheis, assistant in the Public Relations Department and Miss Patricia Walsh, Art Department faculty, was set up in the Day Students Social Room this week.

The various departments cooperated with Sister Eva Marie, Vocational Guidance Director of Nazareth College and her staff in preparing the exhibits, which feature not only the fields most popular with college women but some of the newer fields which are opening to women.

An interesting feature of the exhibit is the display furnished by the American Association of Social Workers to recruit college women for professional social work.

During both lunch periods, Sister Eva Marie, Mrs. Matheis, and faculty members available for counseling students.

Throughout the month of March a series of talks are scheduled primarily for sophomores and freshmen. Speakers will be people engaged in the various fields.

Dr. Arthur Korman, Professor of Plant Pathology, North Carolina State College, a National Science Lecturer, first speaker in the series, included in his lectures given to the science students an outline of the opportunities for college women in the biological sciences.

Last week a series of films prepared by E. R. Squibb & Co. was available to science students who are interested in research.

On Monday, March 8, Captain Mary E. Fraces of the Army Medical Specialist Corps was on the Nazareth campus to meet women who might be interested in the training programs available for Physical Therapists and Occupational Therapists.

Two members of the American Bank Women's Association, an organization of women bank executives, Miss Leah

Woodruff, Assistant Secretary, Community Savings Bank, and Miss Jane Roemmel, Assistant Secretary, Genesee Valley Union Trust Company, spoke to the students on the attractive opportunities for women in banking.

Today, Mr. William Cox, Jr., of the Rochester Public Library staff will present the Library field as an attractive field for college women.

PRIMARY PURPOSE of the March program is to provide vocational orientation to underclassmen, as they prepare to choose their fields of concentration. However, all students are invited and many upperclassmen who have not made a definite occupational choice to arrive at a final decision.
