Walter L. Hahn, professor of Economics and Acting Director of Development at the College of St. Rose, Albany, will be guest speaker at the college's local Alumnae Association communion breakfast Sunday, March 22 at the Treadway Inn.

His topic will be "New Devotions from New York University School of Commerce and his master of commercial science degree in domestic commercial money and banking from N.Y.U.'s Graduate School of Business Administration."

ADDITIONAL COURSES were taken at Harvard, Oxford, Liverpool and Birmingham Universities, the latter two of which he attended while on a sabbatical leave from the college in 1937-38.

During World War II, Prof. Hahn served two and one-half years with the Air Force and is now a Lt. Col. in the active reserves.
