A Daisy Of A Cake

Some people look ahead to the inside, it will not happen quick-ly. The story ends happily. I have frost all 14 pieces of cake. known folks who ask: "What's the left-over frosting may be for dessert?" even before they stored in refrigerator for future use. Store in tightly covered jar. An old English verse "Tis the dessert that graces all the feasts. For an ill meal disparages the rest. A thousand things well done, and one forgot. Defaces obligations by that blot."

BEST BOILED FROSTING
1 c. sugar
1/2 c. water
2 egg whites, stiffly beaten
3 T. confectioners sugar
2 T. white Karo syrup

Combine sugar, water and Karo. Cook to 238 degrees or until syrup spins a thread. Add whites and continue beating for several minutes or until the consistency of heavy cream. Add confectioners sugar and beat for a minute or two. Spread on cakes. Flavor with vanilla or other flavoring if you wish.

1 package golden pound cake mix
1 package lemon pudding and pie filling mix
1 package instant topping mix
1 can angel flake coconut

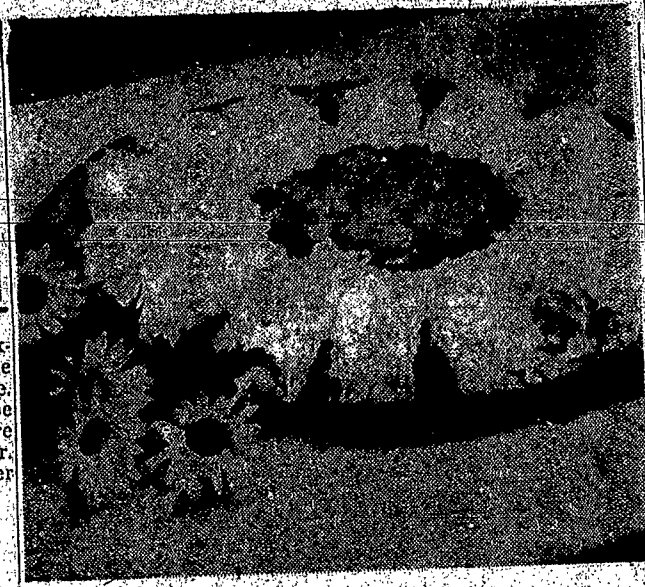

TO GRACE A FEAST
"TO GRACE A FEAST" must be softened until they reach the "eating stage." To tell when they are their "eating best" hold each fruit between cupped hands and press gently.
