**Rochester,
French 'Twin'
To Swap Ideas**

Catholic women of Rochester will soon be swapping recipes, trading pictures of their youngsters and discussing fashion notes with women of their "twin city," Rennes, France.

More important, an exchange of ideas regarding Catholic activities and projects for women is hoped will stem from the "bridge" between the two cities, according to Mrs. Lawrence P. Weis, president of the Monroe County Council of Catholic Women.

THE PLAN FOR an interchange of letters between Catholic women in Rennes and in Rochester was conceived by Mrs. Weis when a group of this city's public figures visited the French city last fall.

Mrs. Weis wrote to Rennes Mayor H. Freville, a Catholic, suggesting the plan and offered to "match" letterwriters by providing information regarding age, occupation, background, interests and hobbies of the Rochester women.

In answering Mrs. Weis' letter, the French mayor said he was "extremely happy" with the plan and had referred it to Cardinal Rogues, Archbishop of Rennes. The Cardinal, he was strongly in favor of the idea.

THE NEW VENTURE has been taken over locally by the International Relations Committee of the DCCW, of which Mrs. Gustave Husson is chairman.

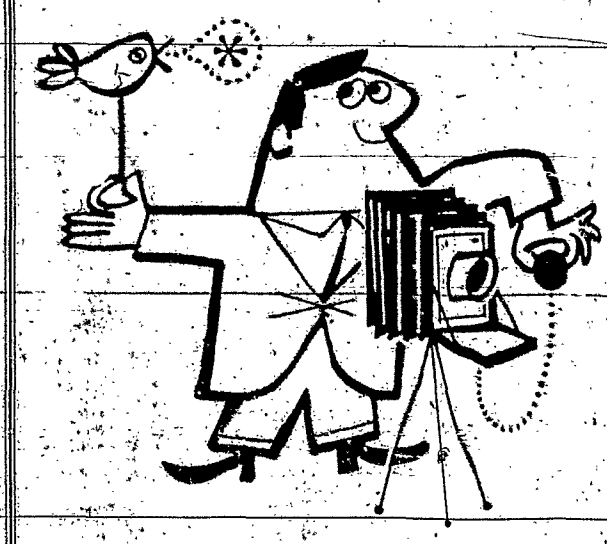
