# Cayuga Society Completes Fifth Parish Building

St. Morris — Rev. W. Thomas Larkin, pastor of Christ the King Church, Jessamine, Fla., and a former Mt. Morris resident, has completed construction of the fifth building in his parish within a period of four years.

On Sunday, March 8, Archbishop Joseph P. Hurley, dedicated the two new buildings which were just completed, a convent, of concrete block and stucco, at a cost of \$72,000 and a new six classroom school addition. The school addition cost \$70,000. The parish school has an enrollment of 650 pupils.

Former U.S. Senator James M. Mead, native of Mt. Morris, was a guest speaker at a meeting of the Holy Name Society of Christ the King parish, Jacksonville, Fla., it is learned here. The former senator, urged the Catholic men to show notable examples of their Catholicity in their chosen fields.

Mead, who is now residing in Clermont, Florida, was introduced by the pastor, Father Larkin, also a native of Mt. Morris. They have been friends for more than 20 years.

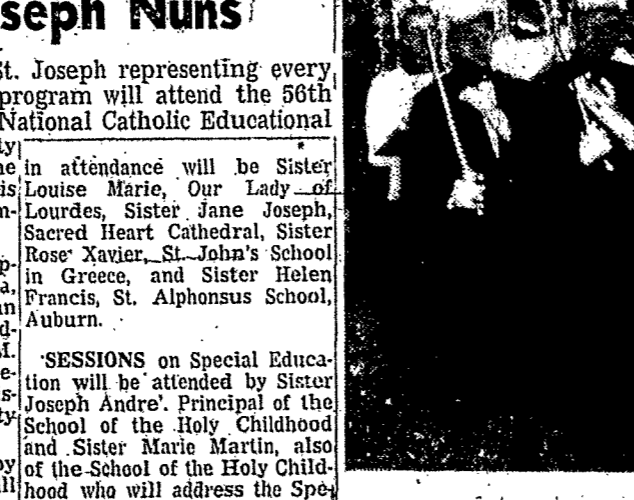
