

Attend Elmira Legion Rite

Some 400 people attended the Acties of the Legion of Mary in St. Patrick's Church, Elmira on Palm Sunday afternoon. The Acties is the solemn expression of fealty and loyalty to Mary, the Queen, made by active members of her Legion.

REV. ALBERT J. SHAMON, Professor of English at St. Andrew's Seminary, spoke on the primary object of the Legion, "Personal Sanctification."

"Desire is the mother of all action," spoke Father Shamon. "Desire, therefore, is and must be the first step towards personal sanctification. Desire sanctifies and you may achieve it, if you desire it not, and you shall never find it."

Father Shamon explained further: "Desire, however, presumes knowledge of the good loved. Knowledge is gleaned from two sources: from without, by books; from within, by meditation. Accordingly, spiritual reading and meditation are the next steps to personal sanctification."


