Knights, Women's Club Hear Corning Pastor

Corning — Rev. Thomas Brennan, pastor of St. Mary's Church, was guest speaker at two Lenten season programs in Corning last week. He was principal speaker at the annual St. Patrick's Day dinner of Corning Council, Knights of Columbus, on Tuesday evening and two nights later addressed members of the Woman's Community Club.

AT THE KC HOME dinner meeting on St. Patrick's Day evening, Father Brennan discussed the life of St. Patrick, who he explained died a bishop at the age of 106 and that the saint's name "will live on forever for his exemplary life and the great works he accomplished."

Some 150 KC members and guests attended the dinner and heard the St. Mary's pastor explain how St. Patrick was captured in France and later sent to Ireland as a slave some 1500 years ago.

THE GUEST SPEAKER was introduced by Vincent J. Welch, chairman, who also introduced the following: the Rev. William Roche of Rochester, formerly of Corning, who is assistant superintendent of Rochester Diocesan schools; the Rev. Thomas Watts, assistant pastor of St. Mary's; the Rev. Simeon Heine, S.A.K., of C. Chaplain, of St. John's Ateneum Seminary at Montour

falls; the Rev. Harold Rodgers, pastor of the T. vacated heart of Mary Church at Painted Post; Mrs. Joseph Paulise, president of the Ladies of L. bus; and Grand Knight James Both.

Both introduced the following Past Grand Knights: Paul Tammaro, Charles Houston, J. Colton Marx, John Osborne, Michael Bonady Paul Lovette; and, also, T. Victor Hanly, Faithful Navigator and James Johnson, basketball coach at Northside High School.

W. W. BABCOCK and Richard Keck, co-chairmen for the dinner, expressed thanks to their committee heads: Joseph Sullivan, Joseph Hayes, Joseph McIntyre, Joseph Daley and F. Dudley McLaughlin and their staffs for doing "an excellent job" in preparing for the program.

Father Brennan took as his topic, "The Religious Orders of Women" as speaker at the Women's Community Club weekly meeting. He outlined the difference between cloistered Orders and those which are called "active." The former, he said, are religious Sisters who confine their work to the convent in which they live. The latter title is used in referring to nuns who teach in schools, nurse in hospitals or do social work.

The speaker referred to the uniform which the Sisters wear, indicating that each Order had a distinctive garb of its own. Very often the dress of the Order is derived from the dress worn by women in the locality "in the Order" began, he explained.

FATHER BRENNAN talked of the experiences during the period of training of the young Sisters before they are admitted to temporary vows.

MR. SPACCIA had resided in Corning for over 40 years. He retired four years ago from Corning Glass Works with 35 years of service. He was a member of St. Vincent de Paul's Parish and the Marconi Lodge Sons of Italy.

Surviving are: four sons, Louis and Domenick Spaccia, Michael and John Carlineo, all of Corning; three daughters, Mrs. Harold Stark of Gang Mills, Mrs. Manuel Nobriga at home and Mrs. Edward Tarantola of Corning; one sister, Mrs. Meccor Crull of Rome, Italy. There are 24 grandchildren and one great-grandson.
