### Nuns Receive Fellowships

Eight Sisters of Mercy have won fellowships for graduate study in the fields of science and mathematics; this past week.

The National Science Foundation has given grants to five faculty members of Our Lady of Mercy High School, enabling them to attend the university of their choice, with all expenses paid, including travel and maintenance.

Sister Mary Stanislaus was awarded a three-year summer grant in earth science to continue graduate studies she has done this year at St. Bonaventure and Syracuse University. Sister Mary Julia has won a two-year summer fellowship for mathematics and will study new trends at Notre Dame University.

Sister Mary Aquin will study her mathematics grant in chemistry, and has been determined, in order to meet new state requirements in the field; she received her master's degree in mathematics at Notre Dame University last summer.

Three-Faculty members of Notre Dame High School, Elmira, have been awarded fellowships for one summer by the National Science Foundation to individual universities of their choice. Under this program, the students follow an integrated course of classes, seminars, sessions with visiting lecturers and field trips.

The Sisters are: Sister Mary Joachim, mathematics, Albany State University; Sister Mary Jane Frances, geology, Villanova University; Sister Mary George, mathematics, Notre Dame University. All three Sisters are continuing graduate work begun in former summers.

Munich — (RNS) — Joseph Cardinal Wendel, Archbishop of Munich, presided at ceremonies here to mark the formal setting up of the planning committee for the 7th International Eucharistic Congress to take place in the Bavarian capital in 1960.

The committee, headed by Auxiliary Bishop Johannes Neuner of Munich, comprises the chairmen of 21 special commissions which will be in charge of the religious, liturgical, artistic and organizational preparations for the event.

One of the highlights of the meeting was the reading by Cardinal Wendel of a special prayer for the Congress written by Pope John XXIII (printed in last week's Courier-Journal).

### New Delegate For Canada

Vatican City — (RNS) — Archbishop Sebastiano Baggio, former Papal Nuncio to Chile, has been named by Pope John XXIII as Apostolic Delegate to Canada.

He will replace Archbishop Giovanni Panico, who was recently named Papal Nuncio to Portugal after having held the Canadian post since early in 1954.

Archbishop Baggio was named to the Chilean office in July, 1953, after having filled various diplomatic posts in El Salvador, Bolivia, Columbia, Venezuela, and Argentina. He also served periods in the Vatican Secretariate of State and the Sacred Consistorial Congregation.
