BEFORE HER entrance into religious life, she had taught school in Coldwater. Sister was born in Gates, the daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Frank Foss. She studied at Charlotte High School, Nazareth College, and St. Bonaventure University.

Several cousins survive. Rev. Robert Keleher, pastor of St. Ignace, was her nephew.
