Lourdes Lecturer Slated In Elmira

The Chemung-Schuyler Deanery National Council of Catholic Women will sponsor a lecture to be given at the Dunn Memorial on Wednesday evening, May 13 at 8 p.m.

Speaker will be Mrs. Winifred Feeley, noted lecturer on the shrine at Lourdes.

Mrs. Feeley was born in China of British parents and spent most of her life in that country. She married an Irish businessman in China. He died after spending some years in a Japanese concentration camp during the last war.

MRS. FEELEY did extensive war work in England, France and Germany during the second World War.

In 1950, she became seriously ill and went to Lourdes to prepare, as she put it, "for a good and holy death." Instead she was reportedly cured in the baths and ever since has devoted her life to working at Lourdes during the pilgrimage season.

She works at the Medical Bureau in the capacity of an interpreter and general helper. Whenever she can, she lectures

Solemn Vespers Broadcast Slated At Owego Parish

Owego—Solemn Vespers will be sung in St. Patrick's Church, Owego, and broadcast over radio Station WBOB Sunday, April 26, at 4 p.m.

Rev. Michael L. Reagan, assistant pastor, will be the celebrant and he will be assisted by Rev. Benedict A. Ehmman, pastor of St. Mary's Church, Watkins Glen and dean of the Rev. Austin Lewinski, O.F.M., Pader, Watkins Glen, as sub-deacon.

REV. JOHN MORSE, of St. James' Church, Johnson City will be the narrator for the broadcast. Vespers will be sung by the mixed choir of 50 voices and a Boys' choir of 40 voices, under the direction of Michael L. Harandza, organist and choir-master of St. Cyril and Method Church, Binghamton.

The choirs will be assisted by members of the Men's Glee Club and the mixed choir of St. Patrick's. Vespers are being sponsored by the Binghamton Chapter of the American Guild of Organists of which Mrs. Anna Meade, organist of St. Patrick's is Dean.

MRS. MEADE WILL play Organ Preludes: "Et in Terra Pater" and "Benedictus" from Suite for Organ by Conperin; "The Processional Hymn," "O God of Loveliness," traditional. The chancel boys' choir will sing the alternating verses of the psalms in Gregorian Chant. Twelve men will sing the antiphons with chanters intoning each antiphon.

The 50 voices of the mixed choir will sing the alternating verses of the psalms in Gregorian Chant. Immediately following Vespers and preceding Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, the Men's Glee Club will sing, "Ave Maria" and "Jesu Redemptor Omnium" both by O. Pure and Fall, author unknown.

THE GLEE CLUB was organized by the Rev. Michael L. Reagan, assistant pastor, and has been directed by Father Reagan with John Davye, director of choral music in the Owego Free Academy as lay director.

Rev. Benedict Ehmman, formerly Professor of Music at St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries, Rochester, will deliver the sermon. Father Ehmman will speak on "The Place of Music in the Divine Liturgy."


