

Chaplain Describes

Religion Aids Mental Health

Alexandria, La. — (NC) — Recent years have seen a "remarkable" recognition of religion's importance and effectiveness in mental health, a chaplain at a mental hospital said here in a National Mental Health Week address.

Father Ernest J. Ziska, O.S.B., Catholic chaplain at Central Louisiana State Hospital, Pineville, La., spoke over radio station KSLV as part of a local observance of the week which will end on May 2.

THE BENEDICTINE priest pointed to research projects on religion and mental health being conducted at several universities, including Loyola of Chicago, and to a national organization, the Academy of Religion and Mental Health, as well as numerous newspaper and magazine articles and books.

"All of these things prove that, finally, from the level of discussions and paying lip service to religion and mental health there is now an actual carrying out of all the challenges," he said.

Special Classes Set For Handicapped Pupils

Newark, N.J. — (NC) — A department of special education for the deaf, blind, mentally retarded and emotionally disturbed has been erected in the Archdiocese of Newark.

In proclaiming the new department, which will be integrated with the school system of the archdiocese, Archbishop Thomas A. Boland declared:

"As the preliminary ground work for this department has already been laid by the Mount Carmel Guild, and has a close alliance with its child program, special education, though administered by our school commission, will continue to operate under the auspices of the Mount Carmel Guild."

Mgr. Joseph A. Dooling is the archdiocesan director of the Mount Carmel Guild.

Mgr. Dooling said that the special education department as part of the school system will "provide special ungraded classes to be located centrally in the four counties" of the archdiocese, for individual instruction of handicapped children.

Germans Give \$7 Million Aid

Cologne — (RNS) — More than \$7,000,000 was raised by Roman Catholics throughout West Germany in a Lenten fund-raising drive for the world's hungry, sponsored by the German hierarchy.

This was disclosed here by a five-bishop committee in charge of the drive which met under the chairmanship of Joseph Cardinal Frings, Archbishop of Cologne, to decide on the distribution of the funds.

The committee announced that the money will be made available to 27 relief projects in Africa, India, Korea, Japan and Madagascar where it will be used to finance both immediate and long-term projects to combat starvation, aid lepers and reduce the death rate of children.

Retarded Bathe In Lourdes Waters

Lourdes — (NC) — Perhaps the most moving moment in this pilgrimage of 63 retarded children, shepherded by Richard Cardinal Cushing, Archbishop of Boston, came as the Cardinal pronounced the Benediction of the Sick at the Holy Rosary Basilica here.

The four-day pilgrimage by plane to Our Lady's Shrine at Lourdes, has tugged at the heartstrings of the free world. Lourdes, accustomed as it is to the touching sight of handicapped pilgrims on the way to the Grotto of St. Bernadette, opened its heart to the 27 girls and 26 boys in the Cardinal's unique pilgrimage.

The shrine itself was described by Cardinal Cushing as "busy in play, busy in love, busy in the marvelous meshing of human activity with Divine grace." He said the 63 retarded children were a "marvel" to everyone.

Many of the children were in wheelchairs or on crutches. But, said the Cardinal, "there was no confusion. I helped them to bathe in the famous Lourdes water. (They) take everything in stride, much more so than the adults."

Pilgrim Plane Forced Down

Gander — (RNS) — Richard Cardinal Cushing, Archbishop of Boston, with a group of 63 crippled and retarded children, was on an Irish Airlines plane which landed safely here after one of its four engines failed over the Atlantic.

Cardinal Cushing was the calmest of all the passengers when the plane made a safe landing while fire trucks and emergency equipment lined the Newfoundland runway. He had breakfast with the children in the airport restaurant.

Commenting on the mishap, the cardinal, a veteran air traveler, said: "It is the will of God. It could happen to any plane. Nobody knew about it until we landed. The kids were wonderful. Nobody got excited. They think it is all part of the plan."

Swiss Build Africa Church

Geneva — (RNS) — Bishop Francois Charriere of Lausanne, Geneva and Fribourg will officiate May 10 at the dedication of a new church in French West Africa built with funds donated by Swiss Roman Catholics.

The church has been named in honor of St. Joan of Arc and is located at Faiteh, in the Dakar Archdiocese. This is the See of Archbishop Marcel LeFebvre, who also is Apostolic Delegate in French West Africa.

Argentina Church Fire

Buenos Aires — (RNS) — Police in Rosario were reported seeking an unidentified man who attempted to burn down the Roman Catholic church of Our Lady Help of Christians in the central Argentine city. The church belongs to the Salesians of St. John Bosco.

It was saved after a priest discovered four outbreaks of fire — two in the apse and two at the main and side altars — and immediately raised the alarm. Other priests as well as students from the adjoining San Jose College helped to smother the flames. The damage was estimated at around \$3,000.

Pope Receives Yugoslav Prelate

Vatican City — (RNS) — Archbishop Josip Ujevic of Belgrade, Yugoslavia, was received in private audience by Pope John XXIII.

Archbishop Ujevic left the Communist capital early in April and was seen off at the local airport by a representative of the State Commission for Religious Affairs. The Communist press said he would confer with Vatican officials on the situation of the Catholic Church in Yugoslavia under the Tito regime.

French Priest At Press Meet

New York — (NC) — The secretary-general of the Inter-national Union of the Catholic Press will speak on the Church's views in modern France at the Catholic Press Association's 49th annual convention in Omaha, Neb., May 12 to 15.

Father Emile Galt, the press union official, will be one of three speakers at a closed briefing for editors on May 14, according to a statement from the CPA.

Other speakers will be Father Albert J. Nevins, M.M., who will talk on the Far East, and Father Thurston N. Davis, S.J., who will speak on Spain.

Pope Names Malta Legate

Vatican City — (RNS) — Pope John XXIII has named Carlo Cardinal Gaddi as Papal Legate to the Knights of Malta "in order to facilitate the important work of this worthy sovereign order."

The Knights of Malta are the oldest order of knights and prelates in the Roman Catholic Church. The membership comprises commanders and several classes of knights.

Arrests Protested

Berlin — (RNS) — The German Catholic Youth Federation protested here against the five to ten year prison terms at hard labor recently imposed by the Soviet Zone court on the Dresden students charged with "anti-state activities."

It said the trial, "during which freedom of the press was revealed once more the use of brutal terror by the East German rulers to crush the young generation's resistance to Communism."

Mme. De Gaulle Visits Shrine

Nevers, France — (NC) — The First Lady of France took advantage of her husband's tour of central France to come to pray before the body of St. Bernadette in the chapel of her convent here.

Mme. Charles de Gaulle was welcomed at the motherhouse of the Sisters of Christian Instruction by Bishop Pierre Pressat, who happened to be in the city when she arrived.
