Plans call for an addition to the school and the construction of a convent.

Bishop Casey To Launch Fund Drive
Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence B. Casey will launch the solicitation for the St. Rita's School-Convent Appeal at a dinner for more than 300 committeemen at 6 p.m. Saturday, May 2, in Holy Trinity Hall, Webster.
Parishwide solicitation of pledges toward the proposed building project is slated from 1:30 to 3:30 p.m. Sunday, May 3. Minimum goal is \$165,000.
AIM OF THE fund appeal is the projected addition of seven rooms to the present 10-classroom St. Rita's School, and the construction of a convent designed to accommodate 13 Sisters of Mercy.
The Rev. Francis A. Kiechhammer, pastor, pointed out that the present 600-pupil school is taxed beyond capacity, with two classes conducted in a remodeled barn and a third in the rear of the church building.
The frame convent at 500 Ridge Rd., adjoining the 25-acre West Webster parish property, which was rented for the four nuns who first staffed the school at its opening in 1955, now is overcrowded for the seven Sisters' new living there, the pastor said.

Ronald G. Mack, former basketball star at Aquinas and LeMoyné University, has been named head basketball coach at Aquinas Institute.

The announcement was made yesterday in a joint statement by Rev. E. P. Magee, C.S.B., principal and Rev. C. F. Carter, C.S.B., director of athletics. Mack, who succeeded Coach Lou Basile, will also teach business subjects at the Basilian Fathers school. He holds a degree in Business Administration.

Blond, tanned and personable, the 23-year-old Mack visited Aquinas last week and chatted with his former teachers. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Carl Mack of 43 Spauld Street and a member of St. James parish.

Final Rites Held For Mrs. Nelson, Mother Of Priest

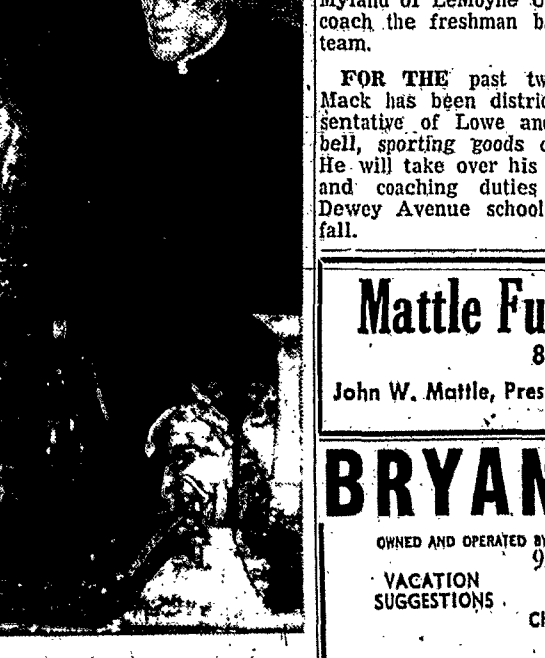
Final rites were held for M. Mary A. Nelson on April 21 from St. Augustine Church and Henry D. Halloran Sons Funeral Home.

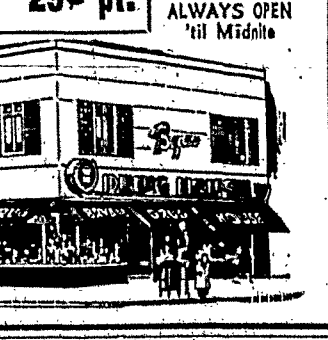
