

High School Retreat Slated For Area Girls

Plans are being completed for the Annual Week End Retreat for High School girls from Elmira and Chemung County.

The pastor of each parish Church has been asked to submit the names of prospective members. Selection is on a merit basis, following the recommendation of the pastor. Requirements include a high rating in the three S's - Social, Scholastic and Spiritual teenage leadership, a spokesman said.

The convent of the Sacred Heart in Rochester will again be the scene of this Retreat, which will open Friday evening, June 26 and close Sunday afternoon, the 28th. Through a special arrangement for the first time, the Retreatants will be high school students only.

THIRTY GIRLS, an increase of fifty percent over former years, will be spiritually sponsored by their pastors or by the chaplain at Notre Dame High School and financially covered by the St. Louise de Marillac Committee of the Ladies of Charity.

Donations are also being accepted from individuals, who may wish to participate in this spiritual project, which is dedicated to the promotion of religious vocations and teen-age leadership.

CHICKEN

1/2 c. butter
1 t. paprika
1 t. salt
Dash pepper
1 frying chicken, cut up
3/4 c. flour
1 c. sherry or water
2 c. sliced fresh mushrooms

SPREAD MUSHROOMS over top of chicken, cover the dish with aluminum foil, continue baking for 30 minutes or until chicken is tender. If you wish to crisp the skin of the chicken you can place it under the broiler for a few minutes. 4 servings.

SERVE FRESH ASPARAGUS for a vegetable. Fresh asparagus is a highly seasonal, springtime delicacy and should be served often for the season is short. Peak supplies should be between May 15 and June 15th. When buying fresh asparagus look for firm, fresh, brittle, bright green stalks with tightly closed, well-formed tips. You can retain the deep green color by cooking until just tender.

I like to place the cleaned stalks in skillet so the stalks will not be broken. Add enough water to cover the bottom of the skillet about 1/4 inch. Steam for about 10 minutes. Serve with melted butter to which a little lemon has been added.

1 c. Graham cracker crumbs
1/4 c. brown sugar
3 T. butter, melted

A MODERN DRAMA

SCENE 1... Three years ago, I met a Stewardess on a flight who asked me what she should do with her life. I said: "If you marry, be sure that you marry one who will be a fitting bow for such a fine Stradivarius; if you do not marry, dedicate yourself totally and entirely to the cause of God, for in this is your perfect peace."

SCENE 2... Eight months ago, the same Stewardess said to the writer: "I have thought over what you told me, and I have made my decision. I want you to find a place for me in the Mission world." We immediately arranged to send her to the Missions.

SCENE 3... At the National Office of The Society for the Propagation of The Faith, the following letter was received from Vietnam:

"I very much like my work and already my Stewardess days seem so far behind me. This type of work has been close to my heart for a long time and, thanks to you, it became a reality.
