Three Stars (Tommy Dorsey) suspect that this "tribute" is a bit of blasphemy. At best, it's a sycophantic sentimentalism. You Made Me Love You (The King Cole Trio) live up to the name. He carries a cool (or "king") boogie-shuffle (The Three Stars) with a good beat. As Time Goes By (John Nash) O.K., although the song has been done better by other artists. It's Just A Matter of Time (Brook Benton) Benton has a pleasing voice, when he stays inside his proper range. A Fool Such As I (Doris Day) Presley Elvis has better material here than he has had in his other recent records. The Flip Side, "I need you love to night," has nothing to recommend it, and the grunting doesn't help. Please Mr. Sun / The Morning Side of the Mountain (Doris Day) Pleasing listening on both sides. Two Brothers (David Hill) Strong competition for the Kingston Trio. Where Were You on Our Wedding Day? (Lloyd Price) A lot. Since I Don't Have You (Skeeter Davis) As they say, they don't have anything. For a Penny (Pat Boone) It's refreshing, once in a while to run into a singer who can actually sing. Kookie, Kookie, Lend Me Your Comb (Edward Byrne) They should supply a trapeze artist. Tallahassee Lassie (Frankie Laine) Like it's in its death agony.

Heavenly Lover (Teresa Brewer) The song is wretched, and Teresa is below her best. The Happy Organ (Dave Corz) Great sound. Who's That Knocking? (Gees) Pretty good knocking on a jockey song. Goodbye Honey, Goodbye (Kathy Lynn) Lovely tune, catchy singing. Kansas City (Everly Brothers) Lonesome, but it has a good blues tune, but the lyrics are sloppy. Tiana (Kingston Trio) The material is only fair, but the singing is fine. I Need Your Loving (Roy Hamilton) His sounds like he needs a psychiatrist. Shirley (John Fred) Monotonous.

POPULAR LPs
Hugo Winterhalter Goes... Latin: Granada, Vaya Con Dios, Ecstasy Tarrago and 8 others. (RCA Victor LPM 1877). Winterhalter's name is not usually associated with the Latin American style, but it shows the mastery of an old friend. The tunes are mostly standards, the arrangements are exciting, and the playing is strong in all sections of the orchestra—with special honorable mention due to the percussion section for a fine, danceable beat. Victor's sound engineers are also in top form. Among the best numbers are: The Peanut Vendor, an original original arrangement; La Macarena, vivid, brilliant music with some magnificent brass sound; Vaya Con Dios, guitar work; and Delicado, an agile arrangement with stellar piano playing. These are personal choices, but the quality is just as high in the other eight numbers. In brief: The versatile Winterhalter orchestra has done one of its best recorded jobs in this set.
