

Sacred Heart Alumnae To Meet In New York

The Twelfth Biennial International Conference of the Alumnae of Sacred Heart Convents and Colleges will be held in greater New York from May 5 to 8.

Superiors, representatives and guests from the 31 U.S. convents and colleges will join those from Canada, South America, Antilles and France, at a meeting at Manhattanville College of the Sacred Heart, Purchase, N.Y. on Wednesday, May 6.

Meetings will also be held at the Sacred Heart Convent, Notion, Conn., Greenwich, Conn. and 91st Street, New York City.

MASS WILL BE offered at St. Patrick's Cathedral, with Cardinal Spellman officiating. Brundage will be served in the dining room of the United Nations, followed by a United Four. A trip around Manhattan Island on a private boat will be included in the program.

A banquet will be served at the Waldorf-Astoria. About 1,000 alumnae and religious are expected to attend.

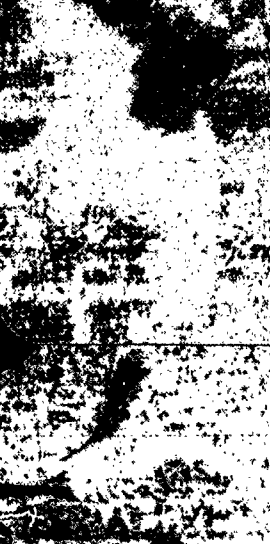
