Science Grants Awarded 2-McQuaid High Teachers

Rev. William McBride, S.J., instructor in Chemistry, and Mr. Thomas Seymour, instructor in Mathematics at McQuaid Jesuit High School, have been awarded grants by the National Science Foundation for summer studies in their respective fields.

FATHER McBRIDE has received a \$500 grant from the foundation which will enable him to pursue studies at Bowdoin College, Brunswick, Maine, in Chemistry. He will attend the Summer Institute for Secondary School Teachers there. The course is being offered to some 30 teachers who plan to present an Advanced Placement Course in Chemistry to high school students.

Mr. Seymour has received his grant, one of fifty from seven hundred applicants through the University of Rochester. The Summer Institute Program offered there is designed to strengthen the subject competence of mathematics and science teachers with a view towards the Advanced Placement Program. The \$850 grant will enable him to pursue this course from June 29 to August 8th.
