

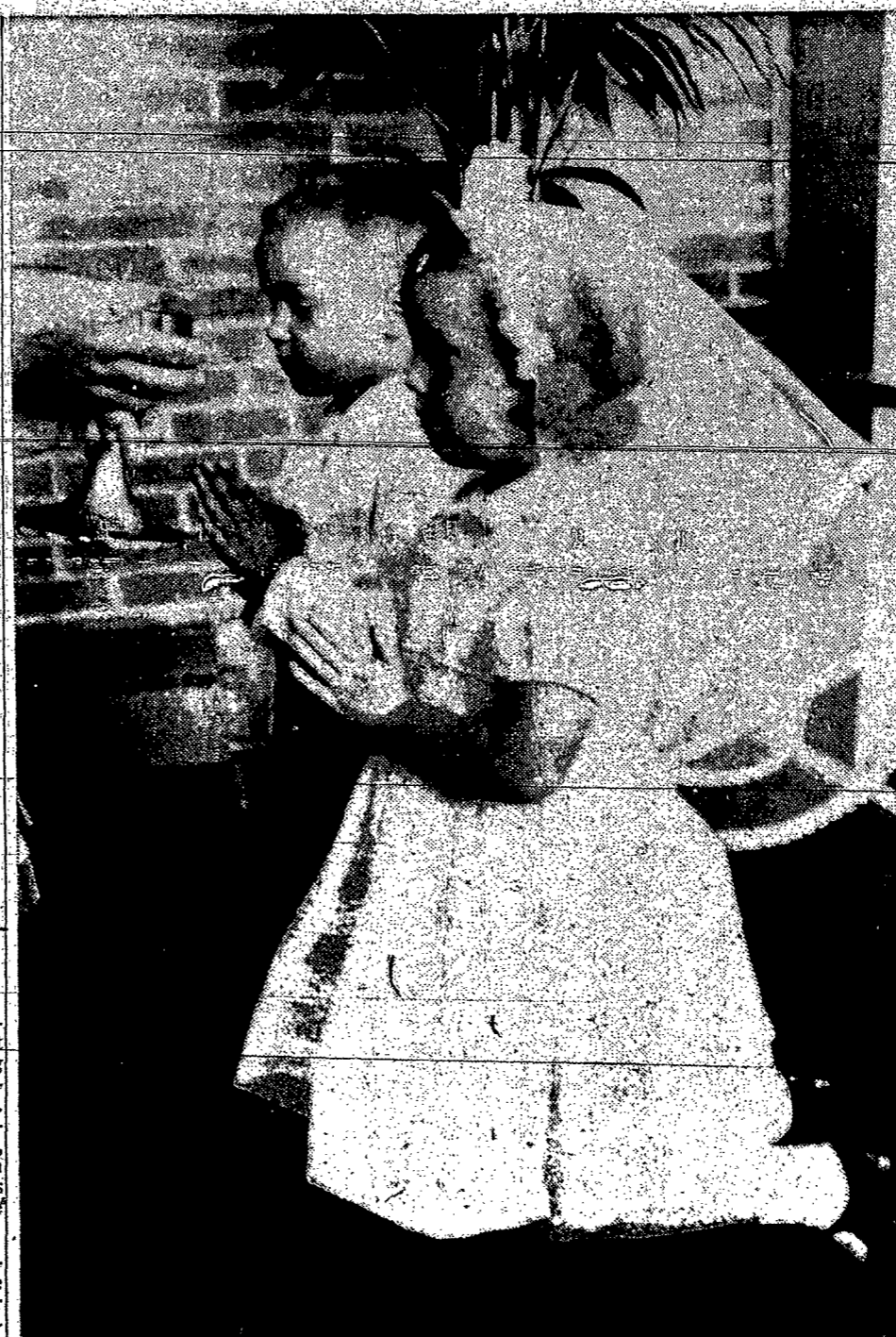
Cenacle Marks Feast Of Patron

St. Agnes Group Takes Tour of Historical Sites

Members of the Timon Club of St. Agnes High School went by chartered bus on a tour of the area cultural and historical sites on Thursday, May 7.

Each club member prepared a short article and explained the historical significance of the locale as they passed through. The topics included the Indian Red Jacket, Marcus Whitman, The Preemption, Sullivan's March, the Finger Lakes, the Phelps-Gorham Purchase, Colonel Williamson, De Montville's Expedition, Myron Clark of Canandaigua.

CANANDAIGUA WAS the first stop, the highlight of which was a conducted tour of the Granger Home. The group then moved on to Geneva to visit St. Stephen's Church, called one of the architectural masterpieces of Western New York.

From there they went by way of Seneca Falls to Auburn where their tour included St. Bernard's Home, the Harriet Tubman and the new Mr. Carmel High School.

Another route was chosen for the return trip bringing them home by way of Palmyra. Arrangements for the day were made by Sister Edwina, the club moderator, and Mary Ann Berg, club president. Several faculty members were guests of the club for the day.
