Turntable Talk

Popular LP's

JACK MARSHALL SEXTET: 18th Century Jazz; Told Every Little Star in Music; We're Sprung Sweet Georgia Brown; Jeppers Creepers. (Capitol 11108).

This record is interesting mainly as an oddity — a performance of modern jazz on 18th-century instruments. The resulting tones are agreeably offbeat, but the performance may strike some jazzophiles as a bit restrained.

The sextet does take off and fly fairly high in a few numbers, but in general they seem to be trying to approximate a classical style of performance. The tunes are all of the "smoother variety — a majority of them by Richard Rodgers and the instrumental colorings lend themselves to a restrained approach. The harpsichord doesn't have the power of the modern piano, and the parts usually given to trumpet or trombone are taken here by flute and recorder. The effect is smooth, but lack of brass is noticeable.

IN BRIEF: A noble experiment performed with partial success.

EDDIE HEYWOOD: The Keys and I; St. Louis Blues; Big Boy; Isle Vamp; All the Way and 9 others. (Victor LP 1900).

Eddie can do almost anything. He wants to do anything, and in this set he does a little bit of everything. Joe Reisman and his orchestra give him solid backing as he demonstrates uniformly high quality in a variety of styles. In at least one number (see out-of-the-world arrangement of "Caravan" in the Night by Jimmy Mundy that sounds tailor-made for stereo) the style defies description. Other styles range from moody blues to straight pop with a touch of swing, and there is some fine work in the Latin-American idiom.

IN BRIEF: Piano and orchestra both show versatile virtuosity in popular styles.

MANTOVANI and his orchestra: Music from the Films: Warsaw Concerto; Legend of the Class Mountain; Serenade at Amore; Story of Three Loves; Dream of Oliver; Cornish Rhapsody; Maryan Rawicz and Walter Landauer at the twin pianos. (London stereo PS 112, monoaural LP 1518).

This is a standard collection of movie music — its average quality somewhat better than the run-of-the-mill Hollywood material. The tone is set by the Warsaw Concerto (which is very well performed here) and most of the other pieces are in the same style but less powerful.

Two exceptions are the "Three Loves" music (by Rachmaninoff) and the Cornish Rhapsody (by Hubert Parry) — both excellent pieces which have won considerable popularity in their own right. Most of the work in this performance is done by the twin pianos, which perform with fine coordination, and by Mantovani's rich string section. Brass, woodwinds and percussion are available, but they take a distinctly secondary role — which is, perhaps, as it should be in this kind of music.

IN BRIEF: Three excellent selections and three others that are fairly standard. Mantovani does well by the music, and the recording is lively does well by Mantovani.

WINIFRED ATWELL: Around the World in 80 Tunes (London stereo, PS 180).

Familiar material is the chief attraction of this charming piano and rhythm collection. Out of the 80 tunes presented, you probably already know and love at least 70. Miss Atwell presents each item pleasantly and briefly in an unpretentious, straightforward style, with an occasional use of jazz-rap tempo to add flavor.

Many of the tunes are associated with various nationalities: the Mexican Hot Dance, Irish Washerwoman, Volga Boatmen. Others are taken from operas: The Toreador Song from Carmen; Grand March from Aida; or from standard recital pieces: Chopin's F-minor impromptu; Rubinstein's Melody in F, etc.

Winifred puts an awful lot of music on one record and the time given to each item is necessarily brief, but it makes entertaining listening and good background music.

IN BRIEF: A melodious collection of popular musical themes.

STEPHEN FOSTER: Song: Oh Susanna; Camplore; Races, Old Folks at Home — and 9 others. National Choir, Boys' Clubs of America. (RCA Victor LPY 1020).
